Guest Speaker

Guest speakers, Ken and Ula Sheather, talked about a small section of their trip to the United States. Beginning with the wild west in a wonderful Western Spirit Museum in Scottsdale, Arizona, to Colorado with its spectacular scenery, a great train trip on the Durango/Silverton railway and a visit to the Western Spirit Museum which housed prized art works which told the story of the clash of cultures between the American Indians and the new settlers.

A visit to the Desert Gardens in Phoenix was interesting. Here Ula and Ken saw their first hummingbirds. These birds visit up to one thousand flowers per day and flap their wings eighty times per second. They can fly forwards, backwards, left right and even upside down. And they are really tiny, easily fitting into a hand.



The wonderful Phoenix Musical Instrument Museum provided them with a superb history of music through displays, videos and samples of recorded music through the ages as well as a cultural excursion through every country in the world. What was to be an hour visit turned out to be five hours of pure entertainment and delight. The Australian section featured Slim Dusty and Joan Sutherland. The museum was built by the CEO of Target who wanted to provide a legacy and information about the world's cultures through music. This museum was certainly a highlight.

Colorado is simply beautiful. Ula and Ken drove through the Rocky Mountains National Park, mostly above the tree line and seeing the snow still on the mountains. Herds of elk were everywhere.

The Durango/Silverton train is one of the world's great train rides to an old silver town with evidence of the life once lived there, including the jail where Bat Masterton was the Marshall. Doc Holliday and Wyatt Earp also spent time there. The train travels through a valley following the river, sometimes very close. This was also a highlight of the trip.

From Colorado they headed to the Four Corners and the wonderful National Parks in the deserts of Arizona and Utah, then heading northwards through Idaho and Montana to Canada.
