### GIIEST SPEAKER CRYSTAL STIBBS

Last week we welcomed the very enthusiastic Crystal Stubbs, Director of the East Gippsland Art Gallery, situated at the old courthouse in Nicholson Street, Bairnsdale. Although she only held the position for 18 months it would appear that she has made quite an impact on the day to day running of the gallery.

East Gippsland Art Gallery was established in 1992 by the then City of Bairnsdale after approached by local residents concerned that there was no public gallery in East Gippsland. Initially, East Gippsland Art Gallery was provided with one room at its current address, which it soon outgrew. Fortunately, it was eventually able to utilise all of the building as exhibition space. Renovations carried out in 2003 greatly improved exhibition facilities, opened up the fover and created a display area for a gallery shop that stocks a range of local fine art and craft items.

This gallery is only one of two in Victoria that is not owned and run by the local Shire. It is funded by the Shire and Creative Victoria and all expenses must be met out of these funds, so as director Crystal is always trying to bring in more money either from grants or fund raising. We are certainly lucky to have such a facility here in our town and it is up to all of us to support it in any way that we can.

The artists have to pay for an exhibition, but the Director has the ability to curate two shows a year to give an opportunity to local artists to exhibit their work at no cost to them. The most popular show is the Reconciliation Exhibition that is an annual event and funded largely by the Shire.

As well as exhibitions, they showcase artists' works in the shop for sale to the public charging a commission. They also conduct many workshops with primary school aged children, which has proved very popular and they have gone from one, to three a month. Part of this cost is met by Uniting Care, which is greatly appreciated. Crystal is all about trying to attract the youth of the town to have the opportunity to interact with art and artists.

After her initial talk Crystal had many questioned fired at her and she demonstrated once again her intense passion for the East Gippsland art Gallery.

Crystal herself is a celebrated glassblower working from the family gallery on the highway between Bairnsdale and Sale. Her

mother Dawn produces beautiful wildlife paintings, her father Chris is a sculptor, sister Kelly specialises in silver jewellery



while brother Lane also works with glass. They are certainly a very talented family and perhaps we should have a vocational visit the next time Crystal fires up her kilns.
