GUEST SPEAKER

Last week we had Elaine Bryant a member of the Rotary Club of Bairnsdale Sunrise, talk to us about Disaster Aid, which was started right here in our District, by the Rotary Club of Endeavour Hills.

It all began for Elaine 18 months ago when she attended a conference held by Disaster Aid, where they asked for volunteers to liaise/talk with local Rotary Clubs and pass on the message, which is quite a powerful one.

Did you know that 4000 children die every day around the world from water borne diseases. It is the dream of Disaster Aid to put an end to that terrible statistic and every little bit helps.

A man named Rhett Butler invented a device that can purify water at the rate of 1000 litres per hour, using small microfibers enclosed in a plastic tower, where water is gravity fed. Although a commercial enterprise, he is dedicated to ensuring that Rotary has access to this at a low cost. The name of the invention is the Sky Hydrant and Rotary have named it Sky Juice.



The unit only weighs 18 kilos and can even be transported to various countries as checked in baggage. Elaine brought one along on the evening and it certainly is a compact unit, with a life of ten years in the field. Being very low maintenance, requiring a manual twist of the top every 24 hours, it is ideal for remote locations, requiring no high technology, other than the microfibres inside.

Before a unit is put in place, the locals are consulted, and nothing is installed if they are not in total agreeance, the motto is to give a" Hand Up" not a "Hand Out" Bhutan has been the recipient of many units and are well on the way to achieving the goal of clean water for every village. The water quality is always tested prior to installing a unit as some chemicals cannot be cleansed by the filters, which have the capability of removing all dirt and bacteria. Of course, constant testing is done at regular intervals.

It was very apparent that these Sky Hydrants are a prized possession of the villages, when insurgents raided a village, the equipment was removed and taken to safety.

Disaster Aid which started by supplying relief boxes after a major disaster have evolved into providing the most suitable aid required at the destination, rebranding themselves as Smart Aid and supplying Safe Water to Every Child. Even a small donation can make a huge difference:

\$10.00 hand tools - \$50.00 a tarp - \$250.00 materials to build a home - \$5000.00 a Sky Hydrant

This year the DG's partners Charlie Speirs has taken it on as his project, to ensure Safe Water for Every Child., so it is up to every club to get behind the project, all monies raised will hopefully be matched by a grant from Foundation to ensure our dollar goes further.

A great talk reminding us all of the great work that rotary does overseas.
