Food for Thought

Inner Wheel is one of the world's largest voluntary women's organisations – 100,000 members and 4,000 of them are in Australia. IW has raised over \$2.6 million towards studying the medical applications of cord blood, including leukaemia, stroke and heart disease, cystic fibrosis, cerebral palsy and prostate cancer.

<u>Guest Speaker – Phoebe Hicks</u>

Last week we had a talk from Phoebe Hicks who spoke about the 'My Health Record' and what it means to us all. It can be described as a one stop shop for all your medical history from all participating health professionals, with high level security which can be set and controlled by the individual.

It will all be put in place by the end of 2018 and everyone will be set up with an account. If you choose to opt out, then you need to contact the government by 15 November 2018. Phoebe's job is to talk to as many groups as possible giving the message about the benefits of staying in the scheme. The polls showed that 95% stated that they would stay in and only 4% would opt out, the remaining 1% being undecided.

As most health professionals already use computer programs to record patient history, it will be an easy transition to upload into the system. Not all are using computers and therefore some records from them would not be available. At many levels in the chain all participants have to be registered and approved by the appropriate authority.

She told us of an instance where a man had a stroke, and he was registered on the system and everything Information can be accessed only if given permission from the patient, as passwords are in place which would only be able to be accessed in an extreme conditions, under what they call a Break Glass Emergency.

It became clear that with all the levels of security in place medical records should be safe and the benefits are many.
