Presidents Report

I write this report in relation to the ongoing drought in our region and the relationship our and other Rotary Clubs are having with farmers in East Gippsland and other charitable organisations helping to ease the burden of the drought. The ongoing drought is really hurting farmers. It must be made clear that the worst drought lasted three years, (1971 to the end of 1973). When thinking about it, at this point the current drought is very serious and could last for some time based on past records.

As a Rotarian and ex farmer, I'm thrilled how the club and other organisations have taken on helping the farming community to get through the current hardship associated in the areas of very little feed for suffering livestock and the mental health of farmers and families. Livestock farmers are also becoming short on clean water for livestock. It should be noted it is so pleasing how so many people in the community are helping with this issue. From experience I have never experienced a rural disaster which has gained so much media coverage which I am very grateful for.

From a Presidents point of view it's fabulous the way all of you have risen to the task of trying to help those not so fortunate. I also think this could mean some farming families may be forced to sell their farms and livestock due to unsustainable debt levels and the shortage of fodder and grain plus absorbent prices being charged for feed.

As I see it, this project could be a long term if the drought does not break, so all Rotarians please be prepared for the possible problems looming. You need to realise that most livestock find this is the hardest time to stay alive during wet windy cold weather. Grass also takes time to grow.

As stated, this is very serious situation and it could get worse meaning Rotary could be involved with for some time. Let's hope we get soaking rains.
