John Ariens , is one of the original members of this Parks Victoria Friends Group. He is an advanced scuba diver and keen photographer as well as an underwater film maker. Others in this group are Don Love – president, Alan Wilkins – treasurer, Mike Irvine - Parks Victoria Ranger and others that may come and go.

John's address focused on what this diving group have done over the last decade and more specifically the achievements over this time.

This aging but active diver has been involved with documenting the friend's group activities using underwater cameras and video showcasing the work that this dedicated group undertake.

These include re- discovering long forgotten 19<sup>th</sup> Century steam ship wrecks that have met their fate at Beware Reef located offshore from Cape Conran in East Gippsland.

The marine life here has been given particular attention, being very special, as the location of this reef is in an ideal location to benefit from the food source known as plankton, microscopic marine life that feeds that most microscopic marine animal to the largest animal on this earth, the blue and humpback whales.

They have shared this historic wreck story and information on Marine Life here, with Parks Victoria, Coast Care, and Reef Life Survey. Presentations are given to the general public by Don Love.



Back in 2007 John was the recipient of a Victorian Coastal Award of excellence 2007 Lifetime Achievement Award that hangs proudly in his office at home!
