Carina Turner 'Environment'

In 2017, Carina attended a workshop held by East Gippsland Shire waste educator on how to be a better recycler.

During the session, there was a very angry participant, who wasn't interested in the tricks on recycling. She wanted to know if the shire would acknowledge the fact that she hadn't put her bins out for 2 years, and would she be able to get a discount on her rates.

Fascinated by the thought of not actually recycling at all, rather than being a better recycler, Carina set out to find out how to achieve this new goal. Through trial and some error, Carina and her family have managed a near zero waste lifestyle, have saved money and no longer know which night is "bin night".

From personal reduction in waste, Carina realised that she could influence others, and tell her story, so that others in the community could also change their waste habits. From Facebook and Instagram her story grew, and so did her reputation around town.

Carina is often spent researching waste around the world, and she believes that the waste industry is broken. It isn't that long ago, when waste wasn't the huge problem that it is today. Back in the 1960's and 70's families put out their one small galvanised rubbish bin once a week.

With the advent of the supermarkets, came the rise in packaging. Everything is now wrapped in plastic, from one slice of steak, to a handful of spinach. In January 2018, much of our plastic waste was exported for the China to sort and recycle until Chinese governmental policy changed This left Australia scrambling to find a market for our plastic waste. India became the next port of call, and last Friday India announced that they were no longer taking waste from the world.

Carina suggests the answer is easier than developing a circular economy, or building plants to burn the waste for energy. It is individually in own our habits. We have lived through the time before the disposable society that we have now. The answer is in our ability to not bring the waste into our homes, and therefore we will not need to throw our waste away, because in reality, there is no away.

Key take aways;

- We can all make a difference
- Small changes do matter
- Know what waste you produce
- Understand why you should reduce your waste production
- Take your containers and bags with you when you shop
- Persuade 10 people what you are doing, and ask then to persuade 10 people because it only has to happen 10 fold for us to change the world (10¹⁰=10 billion)
