

AUSTRALIA DAY HONOURS



Order of Australia Medal John Beynon



Congratulations to Rotarian John Beynon, awarded an Order of Australia (OAM) in the 2020 Australia Day Honours, for service to the community of Bairnsdale.

Always the calm voice of reason, with advice born of experience, we are proud to have John as a member of our club.

Collectively it takes many people to support a successful rural society, but it is John's tireless individual contribution across multiple aspects of community life that makes his involvement stand out. John Beynon has spent a lifetime serving his community and has always regarded this public service as a privilege.

Over the years he has devoted substantial time to the civic, business and community aspects of town life, and has also made significant contributions to the sporting and healthcare sectors for the people of Bairnsdale. John has managed successfully to involve himself and give his time for over a period of almost 50 years, whilst at the same time working in his pharmacy business.

John's has adapted his community service over the years to the current needs of the public, such as being the driving force behind our Clubs Bowlscan Kits initiative, and providing personal hygiene packs for those living rough in Bairnsdale.

One of John's more noticeable achievements was securing the initial funding for what is now the Bairnsdale Aquatic and Recreation Centre (BARC). However, that information isn't common knowledge in East Gippsland, and that's the way he likes it.

John is best described as a quiet achiever, whose reward is seeing noticeable improvements for community members rather than praise for himself. When recognition was given when John received a Paul Harris Fellow in 2007, he saw it simply as a chance to raise awareness of, and promote Rotary projects in Bairnsdale, and an opportunity to motivate others to get involved.

"I was surprised. You do these things and you're not looking for the accolades or anything like that, you just do it," Mr Beynon said on his OAM. "I'm very proud to be recognised by my friends and colleagues and everyone else, very humble about it all. You can't do these things without the support of your family."

Mr Beynon highlighted the importance of volunteers, saying they are the fabric of tight-knit communities. "Volunteers are the backbone of the community and without them it would be a lot worse place. "No one is doing for recognition, they're doing it to help. "It's alright to raise the profile, but it's not for the pat on the back."

Whilst John might view acknowledgement of his achievements as unnecessary fuss, it is because he sees a lifetime of ongoing service to his community as an honour, that he has received this high public recognition.

I would like to thank all the members of RC Bairnsdale that attended and worked the BBQ at the Bushfire Ecumenical Service at St Mary's Church on Monday 27th January.

With Bairnsdale Lions Club there cooking on their BBQ and 18 of our own members present, it was awesome to see the level of community spirit on show.

At our last meeting Brian spoke about the recovery process in relation to clean up and rebuilding. Grocon have a contract to clean up properties, with grants available for some people to rebuild.

Dr Rob Barton, a retired Veterinarian, from the Rotary Club of Bairnsdale Sunrise attended our meeting to ask us about purchasing and allocation of Beef and Sheep Pellets so he could report to the EGRFA committee, in conjunction with RC Bairnsdale's own representatives Martin and Michelle, who is also on RC Bairnsdale's Farmers Relief committee.



Rob wanted advice from RC Bairnsdale (especially Rex) about how we have run an extremely successful and streamlined Farmers Relief program, with wide ranging and varied contacts for donations and allocation with an organised distribution network — to help EGRFA understand how RC Bairnsdale will utilise the operation for the Fire Aid effort.

EGRFA have successfully applied for a US\$25,000 Global Grant from Rotary International for our District, with the help of Janne Spiers. This grant will be spent exclusively on stock pellets. Rex from our club will be coordinating all offers and donations of pellets, hay and lick blocks.

Our voucher system will commence this week, with over 300 stores in towns across East Gippsland on board.

The Cann River Community Event may now occur on February 15. Another community group has booked an event on that date and if EGRFA is to be involved with it, that organisation will let us know.

As many will be aware, our club has been helping farmers during this terrible drought, since August 2018 and have been overwhelmed by the amount of support we have received from Rotarians and the general public.

Now East Gippsland has to deal with the fires that have ravaged country and farms already affected by the drought. Our club continues to support these farmers and will honour our commitment to see this through till it is all over.

Since 1 January 2020 we have joined with the other four Rotary clubs in East Gippsland to form East Gippsland Rotary Fire Aid to maximise the assistance that we can offer to those affected by the fires. Our member Rex who is in charge of the donated hay to drought affected farms, through our Farmers Relief project is now using his contacts to distribute donated hay ear marked for fire affected farms.

The fires have taken a lot of the focus off the drought and some recent rains have eased the situation somewhat, but hot days or winds negate the good of any rain. We are still focused on helping our drought affected farmers (yes there are still many areas in need) and thank all of you out there who have offered support over the last 18 months.

We have taken delivery of 350 bales of donated hay from the Melbourne Water Board in Clyde which was delivered to us freight free. In the picture is Rotarian Bonnie who was featured on the Nine News, which is great coverage.



Rotary Opens Opportunities

RI President-Elect Holger Knack's theme for 2020-21, Rotary Opens Opportunities, asks Rotarians to create opportunities that strengthen their leadership, help put service ideas into action, and improve the lives of those in need.



As aid pours in from across the globe to help bushfire ravaged communities in north-east and eastern Victoria, Melbourne Water is pitching in to help out with a donation of hundreds of hay bales.

The bales - 315 in total - will be transported from a 50-acre Melbourne Water-owned property in Clyde, in Melbourne's south-east, to the Bairnsdale Rotary Club for distribution via its farmer relief campaign.

These bales are bound for those needy

These bales are bound for those needy farmers in fire-affected areas in dire need of a helping hand to feed their stock in the New Year.

"It's been devastating watching the vision over the past month of towns being impacted by these bushfires and seeing the affect it is having on those communities," Melbourne Water's executive general manager service delivery, Nerina Di Lorenzo, said.
"Our South East Regional Office staff, based

"Our South East Regional Office staff, based at Bangholme in Melbourne's south-east, reached out to see how we could contribute to the Gippsland Relief campaign and found this opportunity to help.

"It's been heartening to see so much farm fodder being donated as many animals that have survived the fires have gone without food for days.

"Melbourne Water is only too happy to assist where we can and help ease some of the burden on farmers in the Bairnsdale region and we congratulate the Bairnsdale Rotary Club for its commitment to helping those in their community most affected."

Melbourne Water has also sent a taskforce of 20 firefighters, equipment and vehicles to support the tireless work being done by crews to bring the fires in the East Gippsland region under control.

This taskforce will be relieved by further rotational Melbourne Water crews on an ongoing basis until the fire risk is reduced. "Melbourne Water's fire crews are very pro-

1. Hay, Fodder, Fencing

Many land-owners have insurance for their fencing and only require volunteers to assist with cleaning of fence lines. Others will require hay/fodder for their livestock.

2. Money Vouchers

Allowing people affected to purchase items they determine for themselves at participating businesses, placing money into local retailers which have been hit hard by the loss of the peak holiday season trading.

3. Emergency Fund

For items that sit outside the above two categories and are deemed to be having a great impact on a community or a family and need urgent action.

4. Community BBQ's and Working BeesOrganised to assist and support communities to reconnect.

A number of these items will be given to other organisations that can use them. Brenda will take some other items and Tony D has offered to help sort things out.


