




ROTARY INTERNATIONAL 2020 VIRTUAL CONVENTION

East Gippsland Rotary Fire Aid





The EGRFA Committee has continued to meet via online means and have been receiving ongoing referrals of those in need. The Committee has continued to get vouchers to survivors, hay to desperate stock and 20 foot containers onto properties for storage as people start to gather some belongings again.

The latest development has been the first on site deliveries of caravans which have been refurbished by people within a neighbouring District and that will make a huge difference to people's lives as some are currently living in very poor conditions. Donated generators have also been delivered to some of those who need as the climate is deteriorating quickly, particularly as you get higher into the mountains

The other major undertaking at the moment is the writing of three Global Grant applications which will assist in fire recovery at the request of locals in need.

The first is nearly ready to go and will supply bulka bags, hay and lick blocks for stock which before experiencing bush fires, have been existing in drought conditions for some 4 years. Autumn calving means that many of the cows have calves at foot, so it is even more vital that these animals are receiving the most nutritious feed available.

Although some areas are greening up and look quite good, long term it will be at least twelve months before this grass is strong enough to really withstand stock and definitely before it will be able to be baled for hay or silage.

Training will also be undertaken for farmers to assist them to overcome the drought and fire by use of appropriate pastures, genetic best practices for breeding stock and other aspects of farming.

Volunteer workers in Buchan

Rex and I returned to the Canni Creek Racecourse "Camp" in early May to take donated carpet for the volunteer worker's units.

The units did have bare floors which is not ideal in winter and were hugely thankful for the carpet, with all 11 workers receiving a 4m x 4m section to use for themselves. It was a hive of activity to lay each section of carpet before it rained, as all the furniture in the camp had to moved outside, and back in!

Rex was able to get the carpet donated by a local business, Wayne Comer from Proclean.

These workers are still assisting the farmers of Buchan for fencing and are currently working on 4 different farms to share it around.

They are now working 5 days a week where previously it was 6 days. The work is cold and labour intense, so they are using this free time to take some wellearned rest. All are well, except for one worker who has injured herself while playing some sport during their free time.

They are still being supported by BlazeAid for food, they even have a new volunteer chef arriving before the end of May.

They are a jolly lot who appreciate everything Rotary has given to them, especially the sleeping bags & beanies, and work clothes. They have been 'showing it off' around Buchan, advertising the company logos on the pockets!

It was nice to catch up with the workers and see how they are going.
