

The Farmers Drought Relief Program is one such program that fits the description of a "passion project", and should remain a top priority this year.


While I'm advocating for a greater local community focus, it will not detract from our club's years of work on International, Foundation and other projects.

2020 ANNUAL REPORT (by Pearl Findlay-James)

Since the inception of the East Gippsland Rotary Fire Aid Committee on the 1st January after the most destructive of fires in East Gippsland on December 30th (following a meeting called by then Assistant Governor Anne Cross) a myriad of tasks have been undertaken. These have ranged from much needed assistance with fencing materials, hay and high energy fodder, money vouchers for fire survivors to use in shops / businesses in local towns, provision of warm Winter clothing, King Gee work clothing, donated furniture, white goods and many other desperately needed areas of assistance, which, despite the Covid 19 restrictions of the past three months, have continued to be distributed where possible and still within the bounds of the lockdown. A major recent development has been the delivery of a number of refurbished caravans which have become new homes for some of those previously living in tents on their properties. Thanks go to Rotarians in District 9800 and particularly from the Rotary Club of Melbourne for their role in this venture. I must also mention the grants which we have already received from RAWCS and also the RI Disaster Recovery Fund which have assisted specifically in the areas of fodder and fencing materials.

Since the arrival of the first shipping container on March 13th, progress in this area has been frustrating at the very least. Unfortunately, promised containers have either not arrived or have come extremely slowly resulting in desperately needed — and promised — storage not arriving on site. Other means have been and continue to be sourced but for both the Committee and those

who should have received their containers by now, there has been concern, frustration and angst – especially among survivors who are at times 'walking a fine line' anyway.

The Rotary money vouchers have proved to be a great success with over \$180,000 being distributed to fire affected survivors so far. The vouchers are providing a source of income for local retailers during this very unstable time economically. Committee members visit the family or individual referred to us, carry along a Rotary fruit cake to share over a cuppa. There are also follow up visits to present the vouchers, clothing or other needs as determined during the initial visit.

Valuable contacts have been made within the non-Government sector over the last six months, with Lisa from GIVIT becoming a major asset and her program has added a valuable source of specifically needed goods, not least of which have been generators.

Two Community BBQ days were held at Bruthen and Cann River prior to COVID-19 lockdown, but later in the year, we will assess both the demand and the restrictions and endeavour to continue these events if they are still requested. Assistance to and continued contact with our fire survivors while keeping ourselves safe has been a major priority during the health crisis and the Committee has continued to meet fortnightly by ZOOM with regular emails and phone calls still playing a major role as well. It has been interesting over the last few weeks to see that, while a few survivors are starting to rebuild their lives as insurance comes through and their bonds with us loosen,

as the weather has turned cold there has been a spate of new referrals as some who had tried to 'go it alone' have realised that this is no longer viable and have sought assistance.

We may have slipped from the headlines however we are still in the thoughts of many by continuing to receive both financial donations as well as the incredible Winter clothing response.

As Chairperson I must acknowledge the work of the whole committee as a team, bringing specific skill sets to a situation which has taken us all into unchartered waters. We have achieved an amazing amount of work over a very short time frame and I am very proud to lead this team of dedicated Rotarians. The Rotary family of Districts 9820, 9800, and all other districts within Victoria and beyond have also assisted, financially and physically and we look forward to being able to see many Rotarians and non-Rotarians alike returning to the area as restrictions lift further and we are able to really get into working bees and practical projects to help the overall recovery of this area of our District. Even, as one Club has already done, rebooking Club visits down here, helps our local economy and lifts everyone's spirits enormously.

Thank you all, for assisting us to assist those in desperate need here in East Gippsland.
