Hillview Community Reserve development

Boundary Road, Dromana

There has been some progress in recent months, specifically –

Concrete access path to the Rotary Picnic Shelter – support from Hillview Quarries & Maw Civil Construction

Supply & installation of a Rainwater Tank adjacent to the Picnic Shelter – Victorian Government Grant

Replacement of gate (damaged by vandals), leading to side access road to the Reserve (eastern side of Reserve) – funded by the MPSC

Formation of a gravel path, heading past the Picnic Shelter, to the centre of the Reserve - support from Hillview Quarries & Maw Civil Construction

Culvert installation, drainage & road formwork access, to side access road – funded by the MPSC

Form work in preparation for the Children's Bicycle Pump Track – support from Maw Civil Construction

Tunnelling by Melbourne Water under Boundary Road for sewage line in anticipation of the installation of two Unisex stainless steel Disability Access Toilets – funded by the MPSC

Tunnelling for electricity supply to the Toilets yet to be commenced – funded by the MPSC

Installation of an Electric BBQ – not yet operational, as power needs to be supplied from the opposite side of Boundary Road – funded by Christie Parksafe & installed by Rotary Club of Dromana

Delivery of road formation gravel for the side access road - support from Hillview Quarries

Erection of a futuristic Community Information Sign – support from Rotary Club of Dromana

Tenders have been called by the MPSC for the supply & erection of the Unisex Toilets – cost provided for in the current MPSC Budget

Ongoing maintenance of the Reserve grounds – funded by MPSC Maintenance Contractors

Community Working Bees to remove weeds & plant new trees & shrubs – trees funded by MPSC

Discussions are being held with the Dromana BMX Club, re developing a plan to raise funds & construct a BMX Track on the high side of the Reserve
