



President's Report

I thank the members and their partners of the Drouin Rotary Club for all their support. I have been overwhelmed by the constant involvement and encouragement by all, especially all the board members. We have really continued this club's long history of supporting each other and socialising together. Thank you all.

One of my goals this year was not only to make a difference in Rotary but to also make a difference for members through engagement socially over the year. Pauline and I, with your social committee Don, Glynn and Peter, and with the full support of Yvonne and Liz, have worked hard to achieve this.

Our new social night - '5th Tuesday Night Out' - received excellent support from members and partners at Luciano's, Hong Kong Inn, Parnassus and Middels. The Christmas party at the Drouin Golf Club was a fun end of the year celebration...and the Coads were excellent entertainment. Liz and Glynn organised a great day out in Melbourne to see 'Dream Lover' and then dinner. And lots more.

Drouin Rotarians know how to organise an event. Rotarians and *Elvises*, under the guidance of Don Kelly, organised the Mike Brady night, initiated by Leigh Bates. Without Tim's professionalism and friendship, this year would not have been the success it has. John Tricarico and Roger Playdon, our fundraising and community service directors, have really worked well as a team. They continue to run a very successful and growing produce & craft market, plus much more that has kept us involved and able to raise significant funds.

Once again Bill Petschack organised a successful Swap Meet, with new offside Ian Haughton. Bill is finally stepping back and Gary Scanlon is taking over in 2019. Jeff Copping and Gary Scanlon organised our Farm World involvement. Merv Deppeler got a number of us to conference and helped us exceed our goals with Foundation. And, particular thanks to Jane Playdon for stepping into the new generation portfolio at short notice.

I would like to thank Pauline Maunder and Anita Coonan for this year's programs. It is one of those difficult jobs in the club, well done. Russell Ford kept us informed and up-to-date and Kevin Roberts, aided by Jane, kept us amused and poorer. But without Keith Pretty, the wider world would not have known what we were about. Thank you PR guru. Thanks Peter Konjevic, Clarrie Debnam and William Wong for managing numbers.

Peter Williams and Max Hine kept us all up to date on the welfare of our members and families.


Sergeant at Arms


Public Relations

In October and June, John Tricarico held raffles for locally donated gift vouchers. The proceeds of these have been donated to the 'End Polio Now' fund. Thank you John for assisting with the Club's \$2,300 contribution to the fund.

Our Rotary Club has prepared an application for a District Grant to assist Mawarra renovate their reception area. This project is part of a project undertaken with Mawarra and the Neerim District Lions Club. Thanks go to David and Tim for their assistance with completing and submitting the application.

In March, ten Drouin Rotarians and partners supported the Rotary Club of Pakenham's Rotary Foundation Dinner at the Pakenham horse races. Community Service

In May of 2018 we were again requested to provide urgent support to Olivia's Place to renovate cots for them to supply to waiting clients. This work was solely provided by Maxwell Scott.



The Drouin Cemetery Trust asked our club to support them in straightening and levelling grave stones at the cemetery. A small working group, under the guidance of Ian Symons, started the work on 12th October. The project set off to a good start but as the summer went on the number of volunteers dwindled. It has been a disappointing project that we will review at the beginning of next year.

Our support to the ICE MELTDOWN Project has been ongoing throughout the year. Bob Vogt, Terry Blundell, Jane and Roger Playdon have attended some of their monthly meetings at the Anglican Church Hall. Kevin Roberts and Bob Vogt also attended their 4th Birthday celebration on 7th June.

This year our support to the Drouin Lights Up event was led by Bill Petschack. The Business Group of Drouin asked



us to provide our BBQ and a team to man it on 1st December. All proceeds from the BBQ went to our club. We had a extremely good turn out of volunteers to help at the BBQ. However it must be said that the number of people buying our BBQ items was low and this was partially due to another BBQ having been

set up on the main street of Drouin.

Our support to the Ficifolia Festival parade this year was led by Kevin Roberts with Tim Wills, and we had a very good number of volunteers.

And then, add all the individual contributions by members who are working out in the our community with organisations that include: Committee for Drouin, Friends of Drouin Trees, Drouin History Group, Lyrebird Village, Men's Shed, Longwarry History Group, our churches and schools and, do not forget the 'back-room' organisation for what we as a club do and achieve. It all adds up.

And we have calculated that a TOTAL of at least **2,500** hours have been given directly in service to our community which, at a modest \$25/hour equals **\$62,500** in-kind contribution in the service of our Drouin, district and international communities.
