Pauline Maunder introduced Ellen Burrows who spoke on a project to install 10 photographs from the 1944 Rotary collection on panels in front on Nick's Bakery in Drouin.

This project was initiated by the Shire who presented the group with a very rushed timeline. This timeline was not made easier by the turnover of staff at the shire and time lost familiarising new staff with the project.

In her presentation show showed many of the selected photographs and the talked of the stories behind them.

One of the feature photographs was of Josephine Smith whose interest was digging “perfect” graves. Details such shoulder width, digging only one foot deep at a time etc. A grave 7 foot deep would take all day to dig.

An interesting measure of Drouin's level of prosperity many years ago was the number of households with a vacuum cleaner.
