




# 14th January to 23rd January 2024

#### Party in the Park - Australia Day Friday 26th January



#### An INVITATION from the Warragul & District Garden Club

#### Dear President Pauline,

I am writing to inform you of our club's current project in organising a symposium on Monday 4 March 2024. This event is aimed at improving the awareness of how gardens, and a return to nature, can play a major role in the treatment of mental health issues. This includes the rehabilitation of patients who have suffered trauma, depression, and other stress related problems.

We have been fortunate in securing the lead speaker, Dr Sue Stuart- Smith, an internationally recognised psychiatrist and psychotherapist who, in 2020 published the book "The Well Gardened Mind". This book describes her research into how gardens in general, involvement in horticulture, and a return to nature, can be successfully used to rehabilitate a wide range of mentally based problems.

Dr Stuart -Smith will be joined by two Australians with practical knowledge of horticulture therapy, Steven Wells from the Austin Hospital and Tanya Bearup, a member of the national committee of Therapeutic Horticulture Australia.

Attendees to this symposium will leave with firsthand, practical knowledge as to how they can apply this drug free technique to patients, friends or family members under their support and care.


