





## **PROGRAM – 6th February** Peter Konjevic on 'Coming to Australia'



Peter spoke of his early education as a non English-speaking student in Australia. His parents arrived from Europe in 1948, and although born in Australia, English was not his first language when he started at a Government school.

His memories were not very pleasant ones as teachers gave very little attention to children from non-English speaking backgrounds and he suffered intense bullying and racism at the hands of the other children.

His parents were very concerned for both his welfare and education, so the decision was made that Peter should attend Albury Grammar and then The Scot's School in Albury. Firstly, he attended as a day-boy, then as a weekend border and finally, in his last three years, as a full-time boarder.

He described a highly regimented school regime in which discipline was strict and punishment was swift and, not without considerable discomfort.

A boarder's day started early and by 9:30 lessons had begun, the only breaks were either short or for meals. After school activities were highly structured with clubs, sport and a Scottish Cadet Regiment Corps. The Corps trained in a full military style. It was demanding and exhausting.

Peter has a wonderful way of using words to create images, non more so than describing the cadet uniform as comprising kilts and answering the age old question that they wore nothing under them. An image than none of us will forget was, whilst dressed in kilts students were required to complete a hand stand.

Despite this strictly regimented regime that was physically and mentally demanding, he also remembers many fun times.

As always, Chairman David Proposch thanked Peter and remarked that presentations by our own members, with insights into their lives, are always well received, That was certainly the case with this talk by Peter.
