- 1. Understand member expectations
- 2. Ensure members are actively engaged
- 3. Service that is meaningful to members
- 4. Design member-focused processes
- 5. Ensure physical elements reinforce service quality
- 6. Address problems quickly
- 7. Match 'price' with perceived value
- 8. Measure satisfaction regularly
- 9. Co-ordinate communication
- 10. Keep communication real
