Greetings from President Mike

• Local Invalid Pensioner in need

Tim Wills and I visited a local lady with severe health issues before Christmas, she is in need of assistance in organising a cleanup of her "heavily overgrown" backyard. This is <u>not</u> a call for volunteers to do the clean up, rather she can afford to have a reasonably priced contractor do the job but would like us to assist with organising as she is concerned at having strangers in the house.

If you know of a Reasonably Priced garden clean up company or contractor could you let either Tim or I know so we could organise a site inspection.

• Longwarry Foodbank

Our involvement with the "Longwarry Foodbank" over the Christmas period was very rewarding for those that participated, I would like to share a note from Russell Ford that shows the need in our community is on the increase and will be ongoing in the months ahead, with additional volunteers we could keep it to a once per month task for volunteers, if you can assist please let Russell know.

Those Longwarry Foodbank volunteers are amazed at how we turn up each week, almost unannounced, load up and then head off.

From our efforts we have never failed to complete a delivery that we have been asked to do. There are times when I ask you to do a bit more, because a referral from police or welfare workers comes in overnight, or on those very rare occasions a delivery or a bag has been left behind, there is always one of you ready to complete the task.

I keep all the assignment sheets and have reflected back on the year and conservatively this year we have:

- Had a 30% increase in visits.
- This increase is typical across all support agencies Statewide, and in Baw Baw there is now a developing level of cooperation amongst the bigger agencies to ensure as many people as possible are being reached and that there is at least minimal duplication of "clients".
- In this last half of the year many new referrals are coming from police after doing welfare checks or from social workers and other support agencies who either don't do food relief or from smaller community groups that just don't have access to resources to meet requests coming to them.
- We have conservatively made more than 700 deliveries and delivered nearly 3000 bags of food.
- Possibly one of the immeasurable statistics is giving people who are struggling the knowledge that there are people who care about them.

Deliveries will start again on January 24th, I will be in touch before then.

In case you are wondering, supplies at Longwarry are almost exhausted and the next delivery from Melbourne will be on January 10^{th} . when Longwarry Foodbank will open again for walk ups.

From now until January 24th. there are supplies available to fill emergency calls for help.

Again, thank you everyone and we hope that for the many families and individuals we visit, life improves and for us that we continue in good health.



Paul Harris Fellow Recognition

At the Christmas Dinner, President Mike had the pleasure of recognising the significant contributions of Dick Van Leewuen and Don Blackley awarded each with the Paul Harris Fellow. This is what President Mike said.

Members and guests would be aware that this club, like most in our Zone, consider the presentation of Paul Harris Fellow recognition to be the highest recognition the club gives. And this club has done that seventy seven times. The first was given in 1981 to Fred Armstrong, the club's founding President. Further recognition may be given through the addition of sapphires to the badge, and that has been done for five members by the club and for two by the Rotary Foundation.

Tonight, as a result of the initial nomination by Colin Gardner and Robert Stewart, it is my pleasure to give sapphire recognition to two members to Dick Van Leewuen and Don Blackley.

Firstly, the senior member, by nearly ten months, Dick van Leeuwen:

Dick was inducted into the Club on 4th October 1977 by then-President Russ Rees, sponsored by Gordon Williams. He has therefore been a member for just over 47 years. In 1981-82 he served as President having previously been Programs coordinator, Public Relations chairman, Sergeant-at-Arms and Bulletin editor. He was recognised with a PHF in June 2006 by then-President Ray Howe.

Dick has consistently contributed to the service opportunities of this club and since inception has been one of those delivering food parcels for the Longwarry Lions Food Relief. He takes control of the cashier's drawer for the second shift at most Drouin markets – although often found spending time socialising with fellow Keenagers in the marque. He can be found precariously balancing on the back of a people-mover at Farm World and the Garden Show or putting himself forward to investigate opportunities and provide critique on club activities.

One of his greatest contributions to the club has however been in member attraction, particularly over the past few years, with a total of six credited to his involvement. This record exceeds all other members, with the next highest being four. And Dick's extensive service to our community has often been acknowledged, particularly his chairmanship of the West Gippsland Development Board, and as a Baw Baw Shire Councillor and as Mayor.

Secondly, Don Blackley:

Don Blackley was inducted into the Club on 29th August 1978 by then-President Kevin Fawcett, sponsored by Russ Rees. He has therefore been a member for 46 years and five months. In 1986-87 he served as President, having previously held a number of Director &/or Committee Chairman roles e.g. Foundation, Membership Development, Community Service Awards and, perhaps most notably, Farm World co-ordination from 1994 to 2007. He was recognised with a PHF in June 1999 by then-President Pat Gogan.

Don is not one of those members who is seen at the front all that often but, he has earned the admiration of his fellows as one who could be relied upon to "BE THERE" when needed. And perhaps the most recent example of that is his involvement and extensive knowledge in supporting Russell Ford in the production of the <u>A History of the Rotary Club of Drouin – The First 70 Years</u> last year.

And another significant contribution has been in member attraction, with a total of four credited to his involvement. This record is exceeded only by one other member – Dick Van Leewuen.

Over decades, Don has given extensive service to our community including as a Councillor and <u>final</u> Shire President of the Buln Buln Shire, councillor with Baw Baw Shire and many years' service on the Drouin Cemetery Trust, Drouin History Group...among other involvements.
