Program: Rotary Community Group

Rotarian Tim Wills is the leader of our community of nine clubs which cover the shires of Baw Baw, Bass Coast and South Gippsland.

The 'Rotary Pacific' zone, which includes Rotary clubs of Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific Islands, is one of two "zones" which has begun a three-year pilot program to test an alternative approach to the management and operation of Rotary, a world-wide organisation of around 1.4 million members in 46,000 clubs in 34 zones, within those two zones.

Why test change? The aim is to enhance the "experience" of membership for Rotarians and encourage others to become involved with their local club and, potentially, become members.

One early change has been to group clubs in new 'Rotary Community Groups (RCGs). One such RCG comprises the clubs of Trafalgar, Warragul, Drouin, Korumburra, Leongatha, Foster, Inverloch, Wonthaggi and Phillip Island-San Remo. And on Saturday 24th August, Presidents from six of those clubs came together in then Drouin Community Hub to learn more about each other and plan for future engagement and cooperation.

At the conclusion of their five hours together, the community group, which they chose to name the "Strzelecki Rotary Community", nominated six projects for investigation and possible development into common, shared projects:

- 1. Hygiene for the Homeless: investigate the provision of shower and clothes washing facility in each community;
- 2. Fresh Water in Timor Leste: unite to provide one SkyHydrant fresh water unit to a community in Timor Leste each year;
- 3. Domestic Violence Community Awareness: work to increase community awareness of this issue and support the purchase and distribution of emergency-call lanyards for victims;
- 4. Re-purposing Spectacles in Vanuatu: collecting used eyeglasses for re-purposing;
- 5. Expand Rotary's reach: investigate the development of a "Friends" network of individuals interested in being involved with their local Rotary club for activities of interest, when time permits to the level they can;
- 6. Enhance member experience: investigate within each club what could be done to give members greater enjoyment and satisfaction from their being Rotarians.

At the meeting on Tuesday 3rd September, President Mike thanked Carol Fenwick for her term as Treasurer of our Club.


