CHANGEOVERS FOR 2021-22:

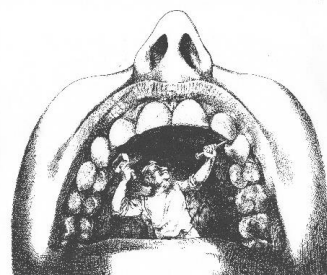
