The Program Schedule has been disrupted over the past few weeks. We will try to keep you posted about programs as news comes to hand.

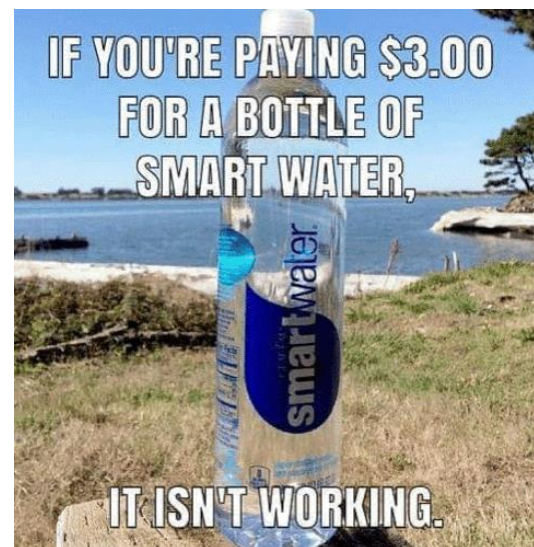

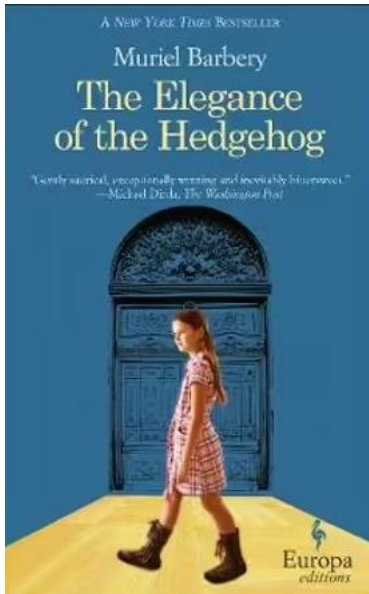

The story follows the life of Renee the concierge of a grand Parisian Apartment building, her secret and her involvement in the lives of the apartment residents.

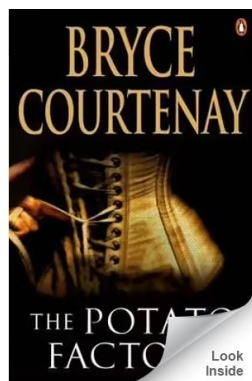
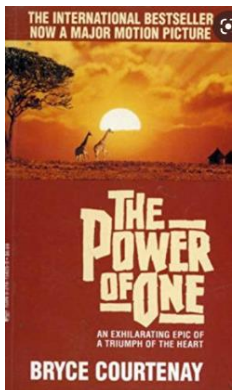
It took me a chapter or two before I was really drawn into the story, but from thereon I was hooked and found it hard to put down.
