The club was well represented at the Remembrance Day service with eight members and partners attending. Our most recent member Cmdr. Sue Bigham (R.A.N.) did an excellent job as MC for the whole event and Lesley Mackenzie laid a wreath on behalf of the club.

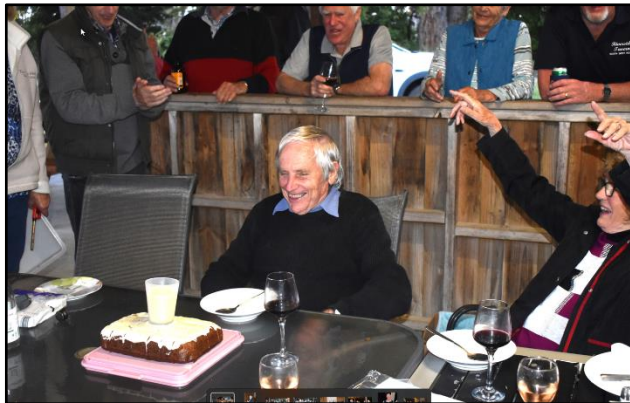
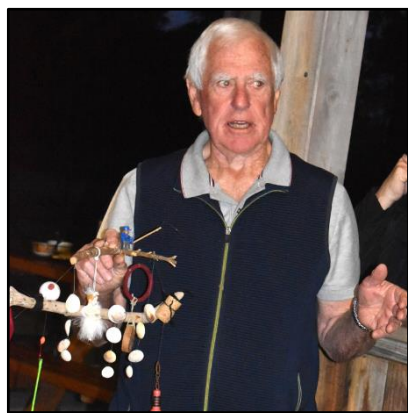
