On my walk from our hotel to the majestic Durham Cathedral I saw that the local Rotary clubs had repurposed the disused telephone Kiosk to accommodate defibrillator for use by the public. We have been given a sausage sizzle slot at Bunnings in Bairnsdale for Sunday the 19^{th of} November however as that is our club's fishing weekend at Bemm River I have requested to change it to the 26^{th of} Nov, and I should hear if that request has been successful on Monday, and I shall inform you accordingly. This can be an important fundraiser for us so it's essential we are able to fulfill our slot so we can make it a regular fundraiser.

Another potential fundraiser, which we have applied for, is the Container Disposal Scheme about to commence on 1st November with the nearest disposal point at the Woolworths car park. See pic below. Approved drinks containers will give a refund of 10 cents which can be donated to an approved organisation. We have had confirmation that our club is a suitable community donation partner. Junior Community Awards. It was decided that certificates to students completing the Rotary Junior Community Awards would be presented with them at their respective schools' assemblies rather than having a special combined presentation. Jeff will be looking for members to accompany him for the presentation, dates to be confirmed.

Saturday night raffles at the Lakes Entrance Sports and Entertainment Centre will commence on Saturday 11th November and will run for 12 weeks. Jeff is currently seeking donations for the raffle with the aim of having 20 prizes each week. Also, on 11th November Lesley will be laying a wreath from our club at the North Arm War Memorial and members are encouraged to attend.

Notes from the AGM.

The position of President Elect was not filled. We are therefore calling for nominations for this position as the current president will not be able to continue for another year. The financial report was accepted.

The new **Club Constitution and By-Laws** were voted on, with 17 in favour and 2 against. The vote to retain the **Invocation** had 17 in favour and 2 against.

The vote for "Acknowledgement of Country" was 3 for **All Meetings**, 8 for **Special Meetings only** and 8 for **Not at all.**


