Saving mothers and children is one of Rotary's six areas of focus and so the Theme for the month of April is "Maternal & Child Health".

Rotary's Six Areas of Service

Rotary International's theme for the month of April is

Maternal and Child Health.

We are extremely lucky that in Australia, generally our maternal and child health is of a high standard. But this is not the case in the rest of the world.

An estimated 5.9 million children under the age of five, die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care and poor sanitation. According to the World Health Organization, nearly 830 women die every day from preventable causes related to pregnancy and childbirth. 99% of maternal deaths occur in developing countries where nearly half of all mothers and newborns do not receive care during and after birth. The leading causes of death for children under 5 are birth complications, pneumonia, birth asphyxia, diahoerra and malaria.

All of these conditions can be prevented and that is where Rotary International steps in. There are hundreds of projects throughout the world which are undertaken by Rotary Clubs, just like ours, that expand access to quality healthcare, giving mothers and children the opportunity to have a healthy future.




