Yippee, it's Summer

Met an incredible young man earlier in the week, Tom Dunn, 23, who is from Horsham and seems to like challenges.

Early in September, this year, Tom commenced a 4,825km self supported triathlon, starting from the northern tip of Cape York down to the southern tip of Wilsons Prom to raise awareness and funds for MITS, the Melbourne Indigenous Transition School.

The 4,825km journey aptly named *Australia's Longest Triathlon*, equal to over 90 Olympic standard triathlons comprising of 3 extraordinary efforts; A cycle leg from the Cape to Sydney, longer than the average Tour De France, a run leg to Lakes via Canberra, further than 22 marathons, and a swim leg from Lakes to Sale, greater than 4 crossings of the British channel and finally a normal Triathlon, ride from Sale to Foster, run to the Prom and swim out to the southern tip.

Unfortunately, Tom was delayed for a couple of days in Nungurner due to the Lakes weather, which was, and still is, unsafe for swimming. Contacts in Lakes Entrance organised a kayak, which Tom is using to complete the leg to Sale after visiting Eagle Point and Bairnsdale on Thursday.

Tom has previously raised over \$97,000 for charity and through the ALT journey he aims to help recognise the work of the Melbourne Indigenous Transition Schools (MITS) organisation and their staff.

This is not the only challenge Tom has taken!

The diversity of the local timber industry of the past is amazing and goes well beyond the common perception of timber for building houses to include railway sleepers, shingles, waterway navigation poles, pier and wharf pylons, power poles, post and rail fencing, toys and red gum 'cobblestones'.

It was a most interesting glimpse of the past and listening to comments ... an exhibition likely to be re-visited. Following our venture into the past we moved onto 'The Main' for a meal and some lively fellowship.
