



Election of District 9820 Representative to Zone 8 Nominating Committee

At the 2020 Rotary International Convention in Honolulu, USA, a Zone Director will be elected from among the Rotarians in our Zone. The Rotary International By Laws provide that a Rotary International director nominee be selected by a Zone Nominating Committee comprising one member from each District in that zone or zone section. District 9820 has an opportunity in selecting a member for the Zone Nominating Committee.

The guidelines for the selection process are set down by Rotary International and each nominating committee applicant is required to fulfil certain criteria for the position.

Both of the District 9820 applicants meet the criteria for selection.

The District 9820 Constitution, Enactments, Resolutions and By Laws Committee has elected to provide each District 9820 Rotary Club the opportunity to vote for the District's representative and alternate representative.

On Monday night, President Alan will ask members to indicate their preference of the 2 candidates listed below and he will then pass on to District our Club's nomination.
