Last year 6500 people came through the gates so they gave 10000 tickets this year. RCMR will be manning one of the gates from 7.30am till 3.00pm and Michael will circulate a roster for completion. Any donations taken from the gates will go to the Farmers Relief Aid and Hay Drive. Next year the show will be spread over 2 days. Lots of performers and services are out to showcase themselves. Bus Dunny races are a new inclusion this year and will race down the racecourse straight. It is yet to be decided if someone will be sitting on the dunny. As it's 100 years of armistice music from 100 years ago will play till 11am and then there will be a slow ride down the straight. A huge family area at no cost will be provided. A motor muster showcasing jot rods, Harley Davidson Easy Riders and Classic Cars is another attraction; as well as the usual farm machinery. There will be a huge Carnival area sporting more rides than the Sale show and a fireworks display.

Michael enlightened us on a proposal from the Canterbury Rotary Club about a partnership with us. This is to offer respite to our farmers and their families in Melbourne. Leanne from Bairnsdale Neighbourhood House is very keen to partner with us also. Leanne and her crew currently support/work with many rural families and will fulfill a most important identification role. We need to be aware that if farmers go for respite that tasks such as feeding animals, milking, general farm tasks etc., still need to be performed.

Alan reported that vendors are enjoying the market Facebook Page and the 'quality' message it is putting out there. The windy conditions were very testing with a number of vendors having to pack up early It was impressive to see the vendors and Rotarians working together to ensure everything was resolved well.
