AN IMPORTANT POLIO MESSAGE FROM RI courtesy of DG JANNE

Dear District Governors and senior leaders,

Many of you will have seen the large coverage of the PNG Polio situation in the Fairfax media yesterday.

Whilst there was much general news value in the report, it is disappointing to note the lack of acknowledgement to Rotary and, more importantly, lack of recognition to the fact that there are TWO strains of Polio and the vaccine derived virus is the focus of attention in PNG! I am writing a letter to the editor this morning but of course there is no guarantee it will be published.

So, I urge you all to the splendid coverage in the October issue of Rotary Down Under – pages 44 to 53 – 'The Annotated Guide to Ending Polio'.

It is absolutely the BEST summary of the total situation to date and I urge you all to immediately contact your Rotary clubs and senior leaders and to ensure as many Rotarians (and partners) as possible read the feature!

It is so pleasing to have definitive answers to all questions – given the many rumours and conflicting reports since the discovery of the vaccine derived virus in PNG.

Please allow me to take this opportunity to update everyone ...

There was one additional case of wild polio in Afghanistan during the past week taking the total in that country this year to 15. Pakistan remains at 4—and the total for the year is now 19, compared with 22 for 2017. Testing and surveillance continues and as long as we keep working hard, the world situation will be controlled. 
