Foreword

Celebrating Fifty Years of Service 1974 - 2024

The following pages reflect on the history of our Club for the period of service 2014 – 2024, details our beginnings, summarises our achievements and looks back on what we have contributed to our society and see how we have enjoyed ourselves as we now look forward to the next journey.

We cannot, however, forget the beginnings of Rotary with Paul Harris in 1905 and the spread of goodwill and service that Rotary International has delivered across the world since then. With 37,123 Clubs in 221 Countries and 1,186,961 Rotarians across the world all dedicated to a cause of Service Above Self. The vision of The Rotary Club of Mornington to expand Rotary guided by the DG's Special Rep. PP Bill McKenzie saw on the 18th of March, 1974 the first meeting of the Interim Rotary Club of Mornington South – Mt Martha with the official Charter granted on the 8th of April 1974.

The Rotary Club of Mt Martha today gives thanks those twenty-six Charter Members led by President Barry Taylor for our club which now celebrates its fiftieth anniversary. From those first days our Club has strongly supported its community of Mt Martha and its surrounds, fiscally, physically, or morally. Many organisations from day one still receive our support. We thank them for their continued support.

Through their various vocations our members have endeavoured to set examples of behaviour that uphold the Rotary Ideals and support our local business houses. Internationally we have keenly supported the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International on many projects. This year the club was recognised as a Major Donor to the Foundation in achieving US\$160,000 in donations. Now a focus on environmental awareness is a new aspect to our Rotary service.

Report on our suspicious night. 12th July, at Whelan's Dava Hotel

It was our most auspicious night! About 220 were in attendance, with
the top brass in local Rotary International officers present: District
Governor Don Pittard & Shirley, PDG Lin Patison & Meg, PDG George Allsop
& Val, PDG Keith Norman & Gwen, DG Nominee Arthur Pullen & Phyl, PDG
Royce Abbey & Jean of District 280; and Club guests Cr. Graeme Otte &
Mrs. Otte (who deputised for the Shire President & Mrs. Gibson), and the
Rev. Dr. A. Watson. Among the apologies were those of PDG John Emerton
and PP Arthur Care, our single club absentee detained in N.Z.

Chairman for the evening was P.P. Bob Smith of our Sponsor Club, the
Rotary Club of Mornington, who, after the invocation by Rev. Lewis
Firman and the Loyal Toast, welcomed all present and introduced visiting
Rotarians. Dr. Watson responded, saying that the new Rotary Club of
Mornington South-Mt. Martha would reinforce Rotary relationships in this
area and he welcomed the club and its charter members into the worldwide
body of Rotary International.

Sergeants-at-Arms Charles Arter and John Grant combined most successfully in extracting fines with excellent humour. P.P. Bill Mackenzie, as D.G's Special Representative in negotiations to get the club going, reported on the progress of events and thanked all those senior R.I. officers who had given him outstanding help in his task. With Barry Taylor as the Charter President, the new Club, said Bill, must reach out into the community to serve.

D.G. Don Pittard then inducted all 25 members present and handed to each the Rotary lapel badge known all over the world. Don addressed the gathering, presenting many thoughtful and challenging sentiments, urging the new members to aim at dedication, commitment and personal involvement in Rotary. He said Rotary's first job was to build men, and both old and new Rotarians need to persevere in the principles of Rotary. The honor of presenting the Club Charter went to P.D.G. Lin Patison who was D.G. at the time of our club formation. Lin presented to President Barry Taylor his chain of office and the Club Charter. Barry, in reply, accepted the office and Charter with an expression of special thanks to the Sponsor Club, the Rotary Club of Mornington, with P.P. Bob Smith as leader and P.P. Bill Mackenzie as D.G's Special Representative. Many banners from the 25 Rotary Clubs represented on the night were handed over to President Barry; Jack Saxton (Frankston) told us of the fines box he gave, PDG Keith Norman donated our new lectern, the Rotary Club of Dromana a R.F. Box, District 282 Rotarians a gavel and bell, and a framed photograph of the Queen came from PDG Lin. Secretary Jack Grigg in acknowledging these inspiring gifts, thanked the donors for their tangible assistance to a young club such as ours.






