## President's - Annual Report 2023-24

Our theme for this past year was to Create Hope in the World and I believe that we as a club have played a significant role in doing this.

We have contributed to our community in many ways, the three standout achievements have been The Container Deposit Scheme which has been a great success with our partnership with Mornington Community Support Centre, this was the vision of Rob Davies who has worked tirelessly on making this happen, with the incredible support of Peter Rawlings doing the administration and the team of Bin Chickens who brave the bins every day of the year. Indeed, the bin chickens have been awarded with badges which they wear with pride. To date 153,250 containers have been collected raising \$18,663

The development of an Interact Club at Balcombe Grammar has been an inspirational step forward by the Youth Service Committee under the leadership of Peter Wiltshire. We look forward to seeing this blossom over the coming months.

Community engagement led by Colin Stokes and the Community Service Committee, we have seen support for the Mount Martha Lifesaving Club MADD swim and Australia Day flag raising, bi monthly fundraising events and membership awareness at Bentons Square and soon we will be having bi monthly BBQs at Mount Martha Village Bunnings BBQs have been amazing and a credit to Bill Cummins for his great organisation. Roger Annear did an excellent job with the organisation of the 4x4 expo.

Wayne Jenkins led the district RORP efforts with 13 playgrounds going to Bougainville.

Membership under the leadership of Gordon Morris's hosted a table at the Seniors expo and tables at some of our Bentons days.

We have given hope to those Internationally with the water project in Ingi, under the leadership of Ray Martin and much enthusiasm from Johnathan Mayne.

We have been part of the continued cluster projects with Interplast.

The support through grants and sponsorship from the Mount Martha Community Bank has been incredible with \$18500 of grant funding and \$6000 of thank sponsorship for the Container Deposit Scheme and support for the Australia Day morning tea for volunteers.

Of course the big event for the year was our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration and Roger Annear did a tremendous job organising it with Nick Roberts as our MC. It was wonderful to see so many past members , partners and family members.

## **Community & Vocation - Annual Report 2023-24**

Our main focus this year was again to be involved and be seen within our community, raising funds to help those in need and providing support to other community volunteer groups.

We have worked hard to strengthen our relations in support of the **Homeless** the **Needy** and those affected by **domestic violence**, by raising funds to support **Fusion and the Mornington Community Support centre.** 

#### BBQ fundraisers: Overall amount raised \$17,000.

**Bunnings:-**We raise considerable funds by undertaking BBQ's at Bunnings, We are fortunate to have at least one BBQ per month allocated to us by Bunnings and a couple of extras on Good Fund raising days. The funds raised so far have far exceeded expectations and along with extra donations made from our customers have enabled us to fulfill our goals above..

**Bentons Square**:-We have also run a number of fund raiser BBQs at Bentons Square with support from the Center Management and with volunteers from the groups we are raising funds for. These Fund Raisers have been run every 2 months and it is planned that they will continue. Organisations supported include Mental Health Safety Net, Mornington Community support centre, Fusion.

**Mt Martha Village:-** Approvals have now been gained from Board and Council to run a number of Lunchtime BBQs outside Ritchies at the Mt Martha Village and will include displaying our CDS trailer. This will allow us to be seen again in the village at Mt Martha and display some of our activities.

**Padua Kinder**- We again were invited to undertake a BBQ for the Padua Kinder community gathering prior to last Christmas, which again was a lot of fun and was quite a good fund raiser. A donation of \$1000 was provided for our effort and our only costs were for the sausages and condiments.

I appreciate the great effort by Bill Cummins in organizing supplies and rosters for the BBQ's, Wayne Jenkins looking after the equipment and trailer, and all those who responded to working on the BBQ and adding to the fun we have amongst ourselves and interacting with the customers.

**Australia Day Ceremony:-** The Club again **organized** this ceremony at the village flag Pole with a number of local Politicians and local business leaders present, plus several volunteers groups. Peter Rawlings, Rob Davies and Roger Annear played a very significant role in the organization of the event.

We were also invited to undertake a breakfast BBQ outside the Life Saving Club during their Australia Day MMAD swim event with Egg and Bacon rolls and Sausages for all the volunteers. Unfortunately the weather brought about an early conclusion to the event. We thank Paul Nitas from Hillview Quarries and Gary Sanford from Mt Martha Community Bank for donations toward BBQ food and Coffees at the Village for volunteers. This also enabled us to make a donation to the MMLSC.

**Fusion:-** We again provided support to fusion and were able to carry out some emergency works when requested to ensure they were able to continue their very valuable help to the young people on site. The plan for the coming year is for our club to renovate another room in their building.

**RORP**:- A separate report is included in the Annual Report however Wayne Jenkins being part of Community committee provided updates on progress at our monthly meetings, and provided programs of harvests of play equipment to be undertaken, and when help from members would be required.

**CDS Project:-** A separate report will also appear in this document covering progress and results for this project. Rob Davies who is Director Environment which is where this project fits, had attended all of the community monthly meetings and has kept the group informed along with Peter Rawlings who has maintained all the records of all the items collected since commencement of the project. The Community Committee members are very involved in the collection process. **Mornington Great Outdoor and 4X4 Expo**. Roger Annear again arranged for the club to provide parking attendants over the 4 day long weekend in March. Unfortunately it was an extremely hot weekend which really tested some of the club members, however adequate members volunteered along with some family and friends who offered to fill the gaps. A very good result was achieved and the RCMM was again very obvious to the thousands who attended. A profit of \$1,742 was achieved.

## Environment – Annual Report 2023-24

For the last two years, the portfolio "Environment" has been represented on the RCMM Board. From 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024, the role will be combined within Community Service. The emphasis and objectives of the role, however, remain the same and RCMM is committed to the concept of Environmental Sustainability as Rotary International's 7<sup>th</sup> Area of Focus.

The Club's involvement with the more obvious Environmental issues have been limited: e.g. Tree Planting (Sunshine Reserve Conservation & Fireguard Group) Clean-up Australia Day (Balcombe Estuary Reserves Group) RePower Mornington Peninsula (Community Decarbonising Network) Mornington Peninsula Shire (Connection with Environmental Team)

**Container Deposit Schemes (CDS) have proven to be of benefit to the environment by reducing litter.** Empty drink containers are less likely to end up discarded recklessly onto the streets and waterways.

"Research has shown that CDS legislation can replicate or increase the environmental and economic benefits of litter reduction and package reduction by avoiding the unnecessary production of new materials, while at the same time reducing the cost of disposing of single-use containers." Professor White ... Institute for Sustainable Futures

On the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2023, **The Rotary Club of Mount Martha (RCMM)** entered into an agreement with Victoria's CDS East Zone Operator, **RETURN-IT**, to operate an "Over The Counter" (OTC) depot in partnership with the **Mornington Community Support Centre (MCSC)** at 320 Main St, Mornington.

**RCMM is fully engaged in this area** and collaborating directly with several other local organisations, who want to get involved in a meaningful way by providing financial benefits to those people or organisations who are motivated and energised to make a difference in the local community. It is important to note that, notwithstanding the worldwide reach of Rotary, **all funds raised through the CDS are directed to our local community.** 

On Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2023, RCMM members together with 24 representatives of our Donors and Supporters acknowledged and celebrated 6 months of remarkable achievement in the CDS project. The 6 month's figure of 114,000 containers collected was proudly announced.

We continue to reach for the sky, only limited by the availability of our human resources.

We congratulate and thank the extraordinary efforts and commitment of our CDS Team, fondly named "Bin Chickens", who collect from our Donors and Supporters, rain, hail or shine, every day, week by week. Roger Annear, Tom Barrett, Bill Cummins, Mark Dobson, Ron Najim, Lyn Rawlings, Anne Shaw, Colin Stokes, Barrie Sweeney, Peter Warren, David Wheeler, Merv Williams.

Pivotal to the success of the CDS project, however, is **CDS Administrator Peter Rawlings**, who spends hours entering figures on a spreadsheet, ensuring we receive our payments, liaising with Zone Operators **Return-It** and our CDS Team, juggling the distribution of funds to our community organisations, and providing encouragement when needed.

## **International - Annual Report 2023-24**

The International Committee members are Roger Annear, David Crane, Jonathan Mayne, Gordon Morriss, John Waterhouse and Ray Martin (Chair)

The year has held some frustrations due to delays costing \$2,000 for missing the deadline of a District Grant. Once again it has been the aim of this Committee to make a difference to human beings in poor circumstances.

The projects supported this year are:

Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM) \$500. RAM provides protection against Malaria in Oceania.

**Rotary Oceana Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC) \$500.** ROMAC brings children requiring expert medical treatment from South East Asia and the Pacific Islands to Australia.

#### Interplast Australia \$1,000.

Interplast sends team of Plastic Surgeons and nurses together with equipment to countries in South East Asia and the Pacific, who treat damaged patients train local doctors and nursing staff.

Shelterbox \$500. Shelterbox provides equipment in areas that have experienced natural disasters or war.

Disaster Aid \$500. Disaster Aid provides water purifying equipment (Skyhydrants)

to remote communities allowing them to have safe clean drinking water.

**School of St Jude, Tanzania \$1,440.** Our support of this great project continues. The school provides young people with education as well as students learning life skills.

**Ingin, PNG School Project \$8,030.** Supported by the Rotary Club of Hervey Bay City (\$5000) We provided water capture and storage and toilets for the school in remote PNG. This school has 600 students who did not have these facilities before. The finishing touches for the project have stalled for the moment but will resume shortly.

Koshish, Nepal \$1,000. We supported the Rotary Club of Rosebud Rye in this project.

The idea is toa assist the impoverished population to become se;f-sufficient in agriculture, where they grow their own food. There is also support for eye health. It is interesting to note that a number of Rotaracters are self funding a trip to Nepal to assist the locals.

## The Rotary Foundation and Centurion Club 2023-24

#### 25 YEARS of MT MARTHA CENTURION CONTRIBUTIONS \$77,000

It is pleasing to report another successful year with membership of the <u>Centurion Club of the Rotary Foundation</u> with four new Centurion members registered this year.

Despite some Centurion members moving on from our Rotary Club with some generous renewals and four new Centurions we have had 31 contributors in 2024.

The total amount raised this year was \$4,260 (2023 \$4,210).

The cumulative figure contributed by the RCMM to the Rotary Foundation, through the Centurion Club, is now \$76,998 growing from \$600 in the year 2000.

Thank you all who have supported generously the Centurion Club contributing to further the great work of The Rotary Foundation.

On top of our personal Centurion funds our Club has contributed \$3,600 directly to the Rotary Foundation and also contributed \$750 to the polio eradication program Polio Plus.

During this our fiftieth year the club presented two Royce Abbey Awards. In doing this our Club has contributed \$2,000 into the Royce & Jean Abbey Endowed Fund within the Rotary Foundation. This fund is used to finance scholarships to assist communities in developing countries, primarily in the Asia-Pacific region. The goal of the scholarship is to provide community leaders from developing nations with practical training and experience in Australia in at least one area consistent with the Rotary Foundation's Six Areas of Focus.

One of the benefits of our contributions to the Foundation is that for each US\$1,000 contributed the club receives recognition points that we can utilise to award and recognise members of our community.

Last year you will recall our Club presented Paul Harris Fellow awards to Ellie-May Maguire, Carol Allen and Byron Groves for their outstanding contributions to our Rotary club and their community. This year our Club will again make worthy Paul Harris Fellow awards. Our congratulations go to those recipients.

Tax deductable donations to the Centurion Club are paid to The Australian Rotary Foundation Trust, funds that are spent in Australia on Australian Rotary projects. New Centurion Club members welcome.

## **Rotary Overseas Relocated Playgrounds (RORP).**

RORP has enjoyed another successful year across D9815 with two full containers being delivered to Bougainville and a second to Cape Town. A third container is being dispatched mid October 2024 to Siem Reap in Northern Cambodia.

RORP has more than fifteen playgrounds allocated for harvesting this financial year, which will then permit a second set of playgrounds for both Cambodia and Bougainville with one long term plan to send playgrounds to Nepal in early 2026.

Over thirty playgrounds in a single year is something our cluster coordinators should be proud of, from Jen and Russell in Berwick, Mel and her Dandenong crew, Trudy and Russell Poole together with Trish from Frankston and Stevie and Tilly from Phillip Island and Inverloch, and finally the ever dependable Mount Maratha crews.

RORP continues to be proud that it is a Cost Neutral Program for all of Rotary D9815 (South), with no funds being sought from our internal Rotary sources to fund the wider RORP program, truly a win-win program for all.

The loading and shipping process is becoming more streamlined, with the storage at the workshop now being fully palletised, hence the forklift makes the loading process so much less human energy dependent.

Some of Melbourne's Bougainville young crew have stepped up and they now spearhead the frontend loading matrix, which is both labour intensive and rather loud with steel items all jostling for a position in the container. Ironically, these same volunteers may either assist in installing the next container destined for Bougainville, or watch their children play on playgrounds that they loaded whilst in Australia.

RORP continues to supply smiles to kids across the world.
