As many of you know The Arc is a human service agency that provides an array of services and supports to individuals with intellectually and developmental disabilities (IDD) and their families. Our services range from Early intervention to residential and day supports for adults of all ages. Tonight I want to highlight our advocacy work. The Arc has a long and successful track record of advocating for the human and civil rights of individuals who have IDD.

Laurie Gustafson, director of community based day program. Our goal is to foster independence and support people to make their own choices. We do whatever we can to help people follow through on their choices. Mike is representative of what we do.

Kudos to the dynamic duo of Shari Goscinak and Dave Hicks who together managed Rotary volunteer meal prep and serving at Father Bill's last January!


Michael Kennedy Continued:
