Mark: very grateful to be invited to talk to the club members tonight. Mark's grandfather was a Rotarian and Mark has memory's of his version of "Happy Bucks" and that Mark had to pay his grandfather for an incident that went awry. Mark Thanked Rotary for the support of SSCA students especially the scholarships given to SSCA students. SSCA is a private, coeducational college prep day school serving pre K through grade 12. SSCA is in it's 22nd year. Classes are intentionally small, 20 to 22 students per class. A key foundation is Service above self.

We believe in academic rigor because we want our students to contribute to the world. We see college as an opportunity for our students find out how they can contribute and bring service to the world.

In literature students read challenging works that make them think about the difference between achieving for self and achieving for others. In every subject we push our students to think about what they are learning in a broader way. We push them to develop grit and perseverance. Humility and justice are a part of the educational experience. Our service groups are committed to helping others. As an example our sports team also contribute to hunger relief service projects. Our National Honor Society group regularly helps with Father Bills. Our juniors and seniors travel to Belize to help in a hospital every other year. The arts are important. Last year student wrote a musical. Before that they wrote a play based upon the holocaust. We see the power or caring for others.

It is our intent that our students share a common foundation: to lean into the world in a way that brings goodness to it. Service above self.

We need people to enter into the world with a different perspective: a humble way ; to love our neighbors as ourselves: that we should treat them well. We at SSCA are proud to serve our community.
