BIKERS AGAINST CHILD ABUSE Chair: Gary Rayberg

Pres Jim introduced Dirt who talked about The Bikers Against Child Abuse. Dirt is a member of the Massachusetts South Shore Chapter. Their mission is to create a safer environment for abused children. Bikers empower children to not feel afraid in the world in which they live. They stand ready to provide support. They work in conjunction with local and state officials who are already in place to protect children. We desire to send a clear message to all that we are prepared to provide physical and emotional support. We stand up ready to shield these children from further abuse. BACA is a 501 C3 non profit organization started in 1995. All funds are obtained by donation and go directly to support the children. BACA was started by a licensed therapist who was a biker. He asked a couple friends to visit one wounded boy. Their support helped the child to come out of his shell. Today there are 254 Chapters world wide, 9000 members worldwide. There are 205 chapters in the US and chapters in ten countries.

Members come from all walks of life, many professionals: teachers, lawyers, accountants to name a few. To become a member you need to go through extensive background checks. There are 24 classes new members have to take. They include how to interact with the child, laws, ect. Members need to commit to being there for a child when needed. People take personal time from work to be in court if needed.

Dirt talked about the different levels of intervention. The goal is to make the child part of the group. More intense intervention can include a presence near the child's house to make them feel safe. The BACA presence in court helps to empower the child to testify. Age range of children supported is up to 17.
