Global Nutrition-Michelle Gilman Steve Gilman- Chairman



Steve Gilman had the pleasure of introducing his fabulous sister Michelle Gilman to speak about Nicaragua's Public Health and Nutrition. Steve stated that Michelle is a world traveler and her sense of adventur-

er has brought her to this particular project, as well as helping out in Guatemala at *Safe Passage*. Through her travels she has recognized that there is a need for nutritious foods in many areas.

Michelle thanked her brother and the Club for allowing her to speak about global nutrition, specifically about school and community gardens. She also applauded the Club on our participation in global projects such as Safe Passage, Worthy Village, and our sanitation project in India.

Michelle attended UMass Amherst and graduated with a Bachelors in Communications with a minor in Spanish. During her time at UMass she studied abroad in Grenada, Spain. This is where her love for the Spanish culture flourished. After graduation she booked a one way ticket to Panama to volunteer in a Hostel. Michelle made her way to Costa Rica where she got her certificate to teach English.



After six months of backpacking, Michelle settled down to teach English in Columbia for six months. While there she participated in a community nutrition program called *Cooking Matters in Nicaragua* while studying for her Mas-

ters at University of Westminster in London. School gardens is the topic of her final dissertation.

In Nicaragua, she immediately felt connection to the work she was doing. On a daily basis Michelle interacted with diverse participants eager to learn about importance of basic nutrition concepts and leaned about the realistic steps they can take towards improving health while keeping costs within limited budget.

She broke down the benefits that include physical exercise, dietary diversity, physical and cognitive development and opportunities for success. The educational aspect includes the importance of hands on learning, biology, chemistry, agriculture and sustainability. The social interactions give the children a sense of community, provide heath interventions and the opportunity for the community to meet the children where they learn, eat and play. Michelle needed to asses the roles of the community participation in the school garden program. She did this by conduct-



ing a baseline study of the nutritional needs of the school and community, assessed the feasibility of the gardens to sustainably improve the nutrition of school meals, explored the factors that encourage and discourage participation in the garden program. She

then reported back to the community her recommendations and the best practices.

Michelle's dissertation will focus on the school gardens expec-

tations versus the reality: how active the community will participate in the project, the importance of school feeding programs and most importantly, the educational success and nutrition the school gardens will provide.
