Lois introduced Anna Dunbar, tonight's guest speaker. While doing her show at WATD, Lois had seen signs about TIC Network and she did not really know much about the organization. Lois invited Anna to speak to us tonight.

Anna is the Executive Director of the Talking Information Center Network. TICN has been around for 40 years but not very well know in the community. Over the last two years she has been working at raising awareness about TICN's mission. A nonprofit radio station for the blind and visually impaired. We provide 24/7 programing 365 days of the year. We read books, periodicals, magazines, newspapers, ect. We have six staff and 200 volunteers. The volunteers donate their time to read. The agency depends on these volunteers. We are statewide and serve 30,000 people. Profiles of listeners include people with Parkinson's, MS, and people who have had strokes and lost reading comprehension. People are getting the information through a human voice. A personal touch. Many listeners are over the age of 65 and many are home alone. We feel that as we provide this services we are also a friend in the room.

We provide national and local news. We try to read every local newspaper of every town in Massachusetts to keep people connected to and knowledgeable about their community. Our studio is in Marshfield. People can listen via radio, or website.

Anna highlighted a few new initiatives: live radio theatre: performances are thanks to volunteers who rehearse then perform live in the studio. A low vision support group that meets in the studio facilitated by a licensed therapist who is also visually impaired. The group is broadcast live for people who can not make it to the studio. We try to cover conferences and events across the state that can provide valuable resources to people with low vision. The studio is in the same building as WATD. Ed Perry the owner of WATD was the founder of the org 40 years ago. He donates the sub carrier signal.

Recently we have gone from reading 160 items to 255 in September. We are always trying to broaden the programing we provide. As an example we now cover the Plymouth Philharmonic and other entertaining programs.
