One thing Rotary 8 does that should not be changed:

- Singing together (not necessarily the Star Spangled Banner) and reciting together the 4-way test.
- Firesides (because Rotarians get to know other Rotarians in depth).
- Fellowship activities (Firesides, re-pack at EFN, Thursday lunches, etc.)
- RYE students' speeches.
- Giving Tree
- Signing cards for Rotarians, who've lost a loved one or suffered an illness.
- Rotary @ 5:00 p.m.
- Core of committed Rotarians to keep values alive and keep us in sync with Rotary International.

One improvement that should be made:

- Focus on recruiting and keeping younger and diverse members. (Need to create a "disappearing task force" comprised of young members to recommend to the Board ways to recruit and maintain young and diverse members. We need to make young and diverse members feel welcome and to understand their family and work obligations. Maybe we need a Young Member dues schedule.)
- Focus upon the exchange student program. (We need to have more Rotarians willing to serve as host families.)
- Want fewer hands-on projects from Projects Committee. (Need to have a fewer, yet popular projects for which many Rotarians will volunteer, e.g., EFN).
- Want bigger impact projects and more public events. (Need to have larger project impact, e.g., Rotary 8 should have been involved in the new Eastside Community Center. Rotary 8 members gave privately, but we should have had Rotary 8 recognized for donating something.)
- Stop singing the national anthem. (Need to have a variety of songs. Younger members and several older members don't like to sing the national anthem, especially given how it has politically divided people recently.)
- Reconsider Rotary Socials. (Fewer members attend than at a Thursday lunch, and the focus is not on what Rotary does, or could do, to help improve the community.)
- Reconsider the Rotary @ 5:00. (Fewer members attend than at a Thursday lunch meeting, and the focus is not on what Rotary does, or could do, to help improve the community.)
- Need a better method for keeping invocations, introductions, and other presentations within their allotted time. (For new member self-introductions we could give them a list of a few bullets to cover. For invocations, we could tell volunteers that members don't enjoy long invocations. For presenters, we may need a long-handled hook!)
