

# Rotary Club of Tacoma #8 Grant Policies and Priorities

Maximum Grant Size: Up to \$5,000.

#### **Grant Application Deadlines for 2020-2021**

Round One: October 2, 2020Round Two: January 28, 2021

### **Prerequisites for Eligibility**

- Organization with current IRS 501(c) (3) status.
- Organization with prior grants are current on 12-month progress reports or by submitting a report with the current application or by the due date on last report form
- Annual report or list of Board members and/or key leadership with occupations
- Most recent financial report
- Most recent 990 (pages 1-9)
- Program or Project Budget
- Organization diversity statement
- Funding status chart

## **Target Populations**

- Low-income children and youth, ages birth 18
- Low-income seniors, age 65 or older

#### Priority projects and programs (P/P)

**Priority 1:** The P/P will **directly** provide the following types of basic services to a target population.

- Food
- Shelter/housing
- Clothing
- Medical/Dental Care
- Mental health
- Violence protection
- Overcoming disabilities
- Household necessities

**Priority 2**: The P/P will **directly** provide the following types of services to a target population.

- Basic literacy
- Early learning (pre-K)
- K-12 intervention, tutoring basic education
- Self-esteem/socialization
- Job training
- Emotional health
- Alcohol and drug use prevention

**Priority 3**: The P/P will **directly** provide the following types of services to a target population.

Focuses on art and music

- Access to parks
- Environment
- K-12 Enrichment (i.e., non-basic education, leadership training, or learning beyond the basic education)

#### **Target Geographical Areas**

- Priority A: 85% or more of the clients reside within the City of Tacoma
- Priority B: Less than 85% of the clients reside within the City of Tacoma

#### Grants will not be awarded to:

- To organizations practicing any form of unlawful discrimination;
- To programs the primary focus of which is political, (e.g., lobbying or supporting campaigns of candidates for public office);
- To grant-making organizations (exceptions may be made if control of Rotary funds can be maintained);
- To programs the primary purpose of which is fostering religion;
- To individuals;
- For academic scholarships to individuals (Rotary 8 has a scholarship program).

# Incomplete or excessive applications will not be considered. Minimum 11 point font.

# Applications must be received by the deadline, not merely postmarked.

- 3. Representatives of the Community Services Grants Committee will make arrangements for a site visit to your organization. Following their site visit, the representatives will report back to the Committee for deliberations.
- 4. Following its deliberations, the Committee will make its recommendations to the Boards of the Rotary Club of Tacoma #8 and the Tacoma Rotary Foundation for final approval of awards.
- 5. Grant decisions are anticipated:
  - Round One: December, 2020
  - Round Two: April, 2021

Allow at least 60 days following those dates for notice of a grant award presentation date.
