

FAQs

Can I see more detailed financial information about TRF?

Yes. The TRF Board reviews these at quarterly meetings and they are available to view at the Club office or at the meetings.

Is the annual Trust distribution restricted to Community Grants?

Yes. The Board of Directors directs distributions to be restricted to the Grants committee to support works of service in Tacoma/Pierce County.

What is the “Fundraising Administrative Expense” in the Fundraising Account?

Our Club relies on a paid staff and office for fundraising support and bookkeeping related to Project Greater Good, the Auction, and other fundraising activities, that would otherwise need to be done by volunteer Club members. The staff and office are paid by the Club Operating Account. The Operating Account is reimbursed by the Annual Fundraising Account for the portion of those expenses attributed to charitable fundraising and bookkeeping.

Why is the total of Community Service Grants larger than the Trust Distribution?

This occurs if the Club Board elects to include additional funds from annual fundraising activities to the Grant Committee budget.

The Trust Fund keeps growing. Is this necessary? Can we give more away now?

Continued Trust growth is essential to provide a sustainable and gradually increasing source of funds over time. The distribution calculation uses long-term methodology for this reason, a percent of the 16-quarter average balance. The TRF Board reviews the distribution percentage annually with the goal of doing as much as possible now while providing the ability to do as much and more into the future, despite inflation and short-term fluctuation in market conditions and annual fundraising.

What donations count toward an Arthur Wickens Fellowship?

Only donations noted to go to the Trust Fund count toward a Wickens Fellowship, which includes gifts to TRF through Project Greater Good.

Do my membership dues pay for service committees?

No. Membership dues are deposited into the Club Operating Account, which is separate from TRF. Membership dues pay for general administrative expenses of the Club, non-charitable committee expenses, as well as Rotary International and District 5020 dues.

Does Fine and True Confession money go to the Foundation?

Payments traceable to an individual are deposited into the Fundraising Account. The money is used for charitable service committee expenses, unless designated as a Trust donation. Cash payments not traceable to an individual are deposited into the Operating Account.

About The Tacoma 8 Rotary Foundation

The Tacoma Rotary 8 Foundation (TRF) is our Club’s charitable foundation.

TRF is governed by a separate Board of Directors consisting of six elected club members and three by virtue of their club office: Tacoma #8 President, President-Elect, and Tacoma Foundation Committee Chair.

TRF is supported by donations from Tacoma #8 members. Contributions to TRF are tax deductible as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization under the Internal Revenue Code. The TRF owns a Trust Fund and a Fundraising Account to accomplish its purposes.

Trust Fund – Long Term Support for Tacoma #8’s Local Works of Service

The TRF Trust Fund exists to provide a sustainable, gradually increasing source of funds over time, protected from inflation and short-term fluctuations in market conditions and donations. Trust distributions are combined with annual fundraising proceeds for local charitable works as determined by the Community Grants Committee.

Trust distributions are calculated as a percentage of the average 16-quarter trust balance on March 30 each year. The percentage is determined annually by the TRF Board.

The TRF Committee fundraises for the Trust through the Project Greater Good annual giving campaign, soliciting single gifts, estate gifts, and other initiatives. Members reaching each \$1,000 level in donations to the TRF Trust Fund are awarded an *Arthur H. Wickens Fellowship*.

Fundraising Account – Annual Fundraising for Tacoma # 8 Works of Service

The Fundraising Account exists for annual fundraising and fundraising expenditures, with proceeds funding the Tacoma #8 service work in the immediately following year. Fundraising includes the Auction, Project Greater Good, and other activities. The Fundraising Account is also used to collect and pass-through donations to the TRF Trust, Rotary International Foundation, and special purpose accounts.

The TRF Board of Trustees has financial oversight responsibility for the Fundraising Account. Budgeting and day-to-day activities pertaining to the Fundraising Account are delegated to the Rotary 8 Club Board of Directors.
