



Suburban Hall of Fame Award

Purpose: To recognize Suburban Rotarians past and present who have made exemplary contributions to Suburban or Rotary International with financial or volunteer works. In doing so, this award aims to recognize a Rotarian or their family members for service well above and beyond Rotary expectations.

This award may be given to the family of the Rotarian if the Rotarian cannot attend due to ill health or death.

The award need not be given every year and should be held to the highest standard.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 1) Member or past member in good standing of Suburban Rotary for at least 5 years.
- 2) Those selected should demonstrate outstanding service in the area of Club work, Community Volunteer work or Rotary's six areas of Focus. Generosity to Rotary when coupled with one of the service areas listed above will be considered.

Approval Process

- 1) Rotarian must be nominated by a Suburban Rotarian with two seconds.
- 2) A committee made up of 5 past Presidents, two current Board members and two Rotarians at large will be appointed by the current President to review the application. A two-thirds vote by closed ballot will be required to move to process to the next level.
- 3) The Nominee will be presented to the current Board by the selection committee for review and approval. The Board must take 30 days to review the nominee and the approval vote must be a two-thirds approval by ballot.
- 4) A regular Suburban Rotary Meeting will be set aside to present this award to the Rotarian or their family.

Award

Bronze Plaque to either mounted on the speaker's stand used by our President or embroidered on a banner designed and displayed at every meeting. Funds for the award would be raised by the Blue Ribbon Committee.
