FAQs

Do I have to attend every Club meeting?

No, this is not necessary. Many members have business, family or other commitments and can't always attend meetings. A regular bulletin keeps you up-to-date with what is happening at the Club.

What happens at Club meetings?

Meetings start promptly at 7:30am and finish at 8:30am sharp. There is a minimum of formality, no anthems, oaths or toasts - just a friendly get-together where we discuss Club projects, listen to a guest speaker and catch up with colleagues over breakfast.

How much time will I need to contribute?

Most members would typically spend two to three hours a month on Rotary activities. Some retired members have more time so may contribute more.

How much does it cost to be part of Rotary?

There is no joining fee and the annual cost is \$280. When you attend a breakfast meeting it costs \$20. Most fundraising activities are designed to raise money from the general public, not from Club members, so you are not expected to participate in all fundraising events.

There are lots of other service clubs - why is Rotary any different?

The combination of networking and humanitarian service creates a unique environment where friendships can thrive, the poor and less fortunate are assisted and personal rewards are maximised. Rotary is different!


I no longer work - can I still join Rotary?

Rotary International is the world's premier community service organisation. It operates in nearly every country and has strong credibility at the highest levels of business and government. It has no political or religious affiliations.

From involvement in the global "End Polio Now" project, to organising a youth leadership activity or helping at a local community event, Rotary provides many opportunities for you to help others.

Each Rotary Club is autonomous and has its own projects but is linked to the global aims and structures of Rotary International. This means that members can get involved anywhere around the world on countless humanitarian projects.

We finish promptly at 8:30am so the rest of the day and your evenings are not affected.
