



We are all Part of the Story – Australia Day Breakfast

Congratulations to Heinz for coordinating an unforgettable Australia day where we were all invited to reflect, respect and celebrate. There was a nice light towards the future with the flags behind the lectern which acknowledge two official Australian flags and the rainbow flag whilst retaining tradition with the single flag on the tables.

Acknowledgement was balanced by affirmation. Liz Kitchen gave a Welcome to Country, Phillip Johnson expressed gratitude that he had no need to repeat this, and Aaron lead us in affirming our loyalty and obedience as Australian Citizens.

Liz used the idea of custody of the land and the call to country as a theme throughout her speech. She highlighted the character of Australia and her people as justification for her desire to achieve citizenship and recognized that what she initially perceived as a gift to her from her chosen country has converted into a deep and significant call for the contributions, she now makes in so many ways.

Phillip's speech was phenomenal! No-one displays the successful outcome of inclusivity better than he does. He has progressed from being a colourblind and self-confessed mediocre school performer through expertise as a climber to world regard as a landscape architect controlling millions of dollars in global budgets. His reconstruction and extension of the successful Best in Show Garden at Chelsea to its present site in Olinda is regarded by some as the best example of its type in Australia. Equally memorable for me was his reference to a visit from an indigenous elder who had been taken from his birth family in Boronia as a child. This man had never previously returned to The Dandenong Ranges but this visit with Phil brought him to tears.

The breakfast certainly showed we are all part of the story and produced an excellent template for Australia Days to come.
