TREASURER'S REPORT 2023-2024

The financial report for the eleven months to the end of May 2023 appears below. The club commenced the year in a solid position.

It was decided to conduct four car shows this session due to the unreliable weather in October and a history of low attendance in January. For the first time entry fees were increased. \$20,000 will still be directly donated to the Royal Children's Hospital.

Australia Day Breakfast was held at the Community Hub and was followed by a free Family Fun Day. The Family Fun Day was totally funded by an \$8,800 grant from the Wandin Seville Community Bank branch of Bendigo Bank and the residual funds from a previous Government Grant. No Club raised funds were required for the event.

In all the accounts we have sufficient funds to meet operational commitments for this year and be well positioned to commence the next Rotary year.

Member numbers for next year will be a challenge on the Club's nondiscretional expenses.

A big thank you to Wendy Bartsch and Les Sharp for pick up and drop off. This community service is being repeated this winter (2024 / 25) A big thank you to Tony Ingpen of Mt Evelyn IGA for his continued support of our Rotary Club. His generous contributions are greatly appreciated.

The recycle battery collection was a great success with President Alan and myself embarking on a four wheel drive trip to collect a trailer load of batteries from Wandin and Croydon. Youth Committee Programs:

EarlyAct

EarlyAct is a school-wide service club for primary school students, overseen by Years 5/6 and sponsored by a local Rotary Club. The purpose of EarlyAct programs is to engage students in character building activities, to prepare them for leadership roles and to identify and carry out meaningful projects which benefit their school, local and international communities. The club has had contact with Coldstream Primary School about a collaboration in this program in the near future.

Rotary Youth Leadership Award [RYLA]

An intensive six-day training program for young people aged 18 to 30. Participants are nominated by local Rotary Clubs based on their community youth leadership potential. The program covers the fundamentals and ethics of positive leadership; communication skills; problem-solving and conflict management; building self confidence and self-esteem. It also promotes Rotary's purpose and service to the community, as well as the elements of community and global citizenship. The club is sponsoring Leah from the Wandin Seville Bendigo Bank for this year's week long program, which will be held in early July.

4 Way Test Speech Contest

A club project which promotes public speaking in a competition for Year 10 students on the topic of Rotary's 4- Way Test, supported by sponsoring Rotary Clubs working in partnership with their local schools and Toastmasters International. Information was sent to UYSC – the program was not pursued.

Primary School Speech Contest

A club project which encourages year 5 and 6 primary school students to develop public speaking skills and raises awareness of Rotary's work in the community.

This project is currently underway. Coldstream PS, Seville PS, Woori Yallock PS, Wandin North PS and Wandin Yallock PS are all participating in the contest. The schools are currently doing the in house practice and selection process to select 2 students from each School to compete in the Contest which will be held on Thursday, August 1st at 6:30pm in the Wandin Yallock multipurpose hall.

Wheelchairs for kids

Wheelchairs for Kids is a volunteer-based not-for-profit organisation providing the transformative gift of mobility to children in impoverished and under resourced communities both in Australia and around the globe.

Many are forced to live on the earthen floor of huts or wait to be carried, making them more vulnerable to disease, malnutrition and armed conflict, as well as experiencing lower educational attainment and higher rates of poverty.

Wandin Rotary supported this cause at a wheelathon event to raise money to support this program. The events were held at Coldstream Primary School and Wandin North Primary School. The club cooked well over 600 sausages which the students paid \$2 each for. This contributed over \$1200 for this worthy cause.







International Report Annual Report 2023-2024

This year has been a year of consolidation in regards to R C Wandin support of International events.

After a bumper fundraising event in May 2023 in support of Shelterbox held at St Patricks Community Centre Lilydale, the distribution of these funds occurred in July 2023 and resulted in a total donation of \$19k to fund the distribution of these emergency kits to house people after a natural disaster such as Earthquakes, Floods and other disasters.

In July 2023 a donation from club funds of \$A1510 to continue the best work of Rotary International to eradicate Polio from the last three vestiges of the world was made. This donation ends up being six times greater than our original gift because it is matched by a local District grant and then doubled by the Bill Gates Foundation.

In May 2024 the Board took the decision to donate \$A5000 to ROMAC (Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children) to fund their ongoing work on bringing children in need of surgical medical treatment to Australia, mostly from neighbouring Pacific Island countries and Timor Leste.

The club has also indicated its support for supporting in a practical way a specific child who is due to come to Melbourne for surgery when the necessary visas and permissions have been granted and the appropriate hospital and medical appointments are made. For our club, we can be justly proud of our significant contributions in the International area of Rotary.
