- Responding to the Afghan Refugee crisis
 - Building on Duxbury Rotary Club's foundational support for Razia Jan's Zebuli school for girls in Afghanistan, in Fall 2021 Duxbury for All creates DARI, working in partnership with established resettlement agencies: Catholic Charities and the Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater Boston.
 - DfA responds to local criticism of its resettlement efforts in town.
 - DARI raises more than \$40,000 from 160 supporters to provide for resettling a young family in Duxbury.
 - More than fifty volunteers come forward to support the housing, educational, health, employment, English language and transportation needs of the family, which arrives in early December.
 - The family is successfully housed; the father is employed locally; all family members have received a thorough medical and dental assessment; the pregnant mother is receiving pre-natal care in Boston; the children are attending Duxbury schools, and ESL classes are underway.







- Year-end assessment
 - DfA's supporter base is approaching 400, which is being tracked in a CRM database.
 - Largely due to the visibility of DfA and DARI, Duxbury Rotary Club membership
 has risen to 29. The Club is now double its pre-pandemic size. Also, four of
 the Town Select Board members have agreed to become honorary members.
 - DfA's Steering Committee numbers twelve, including seven Club members, with local educators and faith leaders.
 - Since its formation in the Summer of 2020, DfA has grown significantly and taken on many tasks, but not always in a planned, methodical way.
 - The Steering Committee decided it was time for a further Strategic Review to strengthen the organization and position it for 2022 and beyond.







• The DfA Steering Committee has outlined the following projects for 2022:

A **Community Listening Event** is being hosted on March 2 at which other Community Based Organizations and Town Government will present their DEI accomplishments in 2021 and identify areas of concern. From this, DfA will identify two or three key areas of concern (-isms) and create a year-long program to understand and address each of them, using the "Listen-Reflect-Act-Share" rubric.

A Regional DEI Meeting is being hosted on March 29 at which DfA, Duxbury Schools and the Town Select Board will share their DEI experiences and accomplishments with other activist groups, towns and school administrators in SE Massachusetts. Duxbury appears unique, in that it has a Town Select Board committed to DEI within government and the community at large, a school department led by a new Superintendent supported by a DEI Director, and DfA representing a growing segment of the population.





 The DfA Steering Committee has outlined the following projects for 2022 (continued):

An adult learning program is being developed to consider **The 1619 Project**.

This is expected to run over the course of next year or so, and will be professionally curated and moderated. We expect to partner with the Senior Center, Duxbury Public Library, Duxbury Rural & Historical Society, Duxbury Student Union and others in presenting this series.

• In addition to its DfA activities, Duxbury Rotary Club is completing the District DEI Challenge; it has completed a DEI survey of its members and plans to appoint a DEI Chair to ensure that the Club continues to diversify and is welcoming to all members.
