In review

Aug. 13, 2015

Our very own **President Jennifer Bennerotte** welcomed us to our weekly meeting. She received a resounding "Yeah baby!" from Scott MacDonald.

Wayne Harmon led us in a meaningful invocation pointing out how blessed we are to be able to serve others through Rotary and the great fellowship and camaraderie we enjoy. Wayne then led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and Four-Way Test, after which **Scott MacDonald** asked, "What about #5? Is it fun?"

Bob Solheim encouraged everyone to attend the grand opening of the Carl N. Platou Emergency Center addition at Fairview Southdale Hospital on Friday (see photos on page 4). He noted that our club has made a significant contribution and our fellow Rotarian Brad Beard would love to see us there.

Mary Swendsen, Community Service—Local Projects director, then mentioned two projects our club participated in last year. She thanked and recognized those Rotarians who helped with the VEAP lunch-packing programs. Several times last year Rotarians gathered on a Thursday night to pack lunches for children who might not otherwise have a healthy lunch to eat over the weekend. Mary then explained that several Rotarians went to Creek Valley Elementary last year and read the book Andy & Elmer's Apple Dumpling Adventure to third-graders. The book tells a story that utilizes the Rotary Four-Way Test. The Rotarians also baked apple dumplings for the students. Mary asked for Rotarians to volunteer for both projects this fall.

Rotarian **Don Hutchison**, who lived in eight different states before returning back to Minnesota, introduced our guest speaker Tom Chorske. Tom played hockey at Southwest High School and was named Mr. Hockey as the state's most outstanding high school player in 1985. He was drafted by the Montreal Canadiens sixteenth overall in the 1985 NHL Entry Draft. After being drafted, Tom played four seasons for the University of Minnesota before starting his professional career. It did not work out well in Montreal and Tom said getting traded to New Jersey was like a breath of fresh air.

Tom then told us of the evolution of taking a run of the mill hockey team to a championship team winning the Stanley Cup. He said it started with the coach, Jacques Lemaire, who shared a set of values and goals that he rolled into a system on how the team was going to play on the ice. The entire team had the goal of winning the Stanley Cup and they were all on the same page. That built trust and camaraderie with shared goals and they were committed to each other.

Tom said it is most important getting the culture and environment right. If a star player is only concerned about themselves, then he can be a cancer to the team. True leadership is all about serving others. He said there is no human relations department on an NHL hockey team. If someone challenges you, or swears at you, it might result in a fight. Yet, it is a fascinating way to deal with internal issues and the fastest way to resolution. Tom explained that every player on a team has a role and is part of the process and part of the team. He said it was the healthy culture and "team process" that allowed his team to upset the Detroit Red Wings in four straight games. Tom shared that it is critical to have a core group of leaders who act as culture carriers. If there is no core group, too much change can disrupt the culture. He said that whether it is in pro sports, Rotary or business, it is up to the leaders to coach people up to accept the culture. Tom was asked about specialization in sports at a younger and younger age in children today. He commented that he played quarterback in high school and he is not a fan of specialization at a young age. He said that the muscles someone uses to play tennis are much different than football or hockey and that helps to become a better athlete.

Mike Kallas thanked Tom for his talk and explained that our club was going to donate a book in his name to Edina Schools.

President Bennerotte closed the meeting with a quote from the great Wayne Gretzky: "You miss 100 percent of the shots you never take."




