San Asato introduced our speaker, District Governor **Tim Murphy**. His visit represented his 25th club visit since July I, a very ambitious schedule. He outlined our club's accomplishments. He highlighted some of our accomplishments in giving to The Rotary Foundation. Last year, we contributed \$91,734 to the Annual Fund for a per capita giving of \$584! The

Tom also pointed out that we are now the largest club in the District. We have actually increased members while most clubs have lost members. Overall, we are the No. I club in the Universe. Growth in Rotary membership is occurring overseas while America is declining in an equal amount.

Tim touched on the three goals of Rotary International Strategic Plan. They are Support & Strengthen Clubs, Enhance Public Image and Awareness and Focus on and Increase Humanitarian Service. These are all built around our core values of Fellowship, Integrity, Diversity, Service and Leadership.

In closing Tim quoted RI President Ravi, "Our time has come, it will never come again.

Be a Gift to the World."

Charlie McGoldrick thanked Tim, explaining that our club will donate a book in his name to the Edina Schools.

President Bennerotte closed the meeting with a quote from Nelson Mandela about "servant leadership."




















