Bill has been active in more business pursuits and served on more boards of directors than one could possibly imagine. He is an accomplished tennis player, humorist and enjoys relaxing aboard a 36' sailing vessel he has on Lake Superior. He said his greatest life accomplishment was marrying his lovely wife, Kathy, who was present to support this amazing presentation! He is also backed by three children and numerous grandchildren. The clock struck I p.m. and **Jennifer** brought **Ken Andersen** to the podium to introduce our guest speaker. She told us that Ken and his wife co-founded the Minnetonka JC's organization, that he is a former accountant now working in real estate, and that his favorite past time is dancing. Currently Ken is director of member retention for the club. Ken introduced *Star Tribune* restaurant critic Rick Nelson as our program speaker, someone who recently gave up his anonymity as an undercover restaurant reviewer, allowing the public to know what he looked like and if they were eating at the same restaurant as him.

Mr. Rick Nelson began his talk with us by pointing out the humor he felt was present for him to have a master's degree in marketing from the University of Minnesota and finding himself in a career as a restaurant critic, working for over 15 years with the Minneapolis Star Tribune, with absolutely no journalism training or experience. He has thoroughly enjoyed being a food writer these years and takes very seriously the responsibility of reporting accurately and fairly on what he experiences in restaurants. He said some 300,000 potential readers of his work are depending on him to provide useful information. Rick fielded a number of good questions from the membership. We learned that he doesn't "clean his plate," because he eats too many meals in a day for "work," and seldom, if ever, takes food home with him. He said he recognizes how very difficult it is to run a restaurant successfully for a period of years in this market, and feels bad when he must report on a negative experiences from some that are working hard but not providing excellent food/service. He said he likes the food truck concept and thinks the State Fair could benefit from what they have to offer. That several of the food trucks have started small like that and sprouted into successful restaurants. He said some of his favorite restaurants are Restaurant Alma, Birchwood Café (Seward neighborhood), Al's Breakfast, Spoon and Stable, and Bachelor Farmer.

Les Jones respectfully thanked Rick for his interesting presentation, informing him of Rotary's work in the world and that a gift of a book would be provided in his honor to a young person in our community.
