### In Review

Aug. 21, 2014

Our illustrious president, Jeffrey Ohe, opened the meeting at 12:40 p.m. We enjoyed our Deli Big Buffet prepared by the great ECC staff.

We were greeted by new members Jodie Jennings, Colleen Simpson, as well as President-Elect Jennifer Bennerotte. The front desk was staffed by Chuck Rauenhorst and Audri Schwarz. Invocation was by Chuck Agan. Extremely abbreviated guest introductions by Past President Scott **MacDonald**, or if you are into the whole brevity thing, Mac Daddy. The Barker was handled by yours truly, and Norberto **Moran** handled the thank-you to the speaker.

Fortunately, I had studied up in anticipation of writing this week's Barker, having previously read Scott Mac's "Handy Hints For Writing The Rotary News Letter" (forward by Burt **Cohen**), which is currently in its 50<sup>th</sup> printing. Michael Stanzak put in a plug for the Club event Motown the Musical, happening Dec. 22, at the Orpheum Theater. Sign up soon, space is limited.

Scott Tankenoff was then summoned to the podium to give his classification talk. Scott joined Rotary in May 2014. He is with Hillcrest Development, which is a multigenerational family business based in Minneapolis. Hillcrest specializes in commercial renovation. The firm is currently working on the Pentagon Park area of Edina. Construction is underway on 300,000 of the 750,000-square-foot project. The update to Pentagon Park will come as a welcome addition to an area that was synonymous with blight and failure in recent years. Welcome Scott! We look forward to your active participation in the Club.

Community Service Director Mike Kallas then introduced Shelly Heimer from Can-Do Canines, who received a grant of \$2,500 from the Rotary Club of Edina Foundation for the purchase of a high-performance router, microphone system, mixer, draping, skirting, a window shade display and presentation stand and lectern to improve their community room for their graduation ceremony. Ann Platt, president-elect elect, immediately visited Mike's table to request equal funds to redecorate her living room. Motion was denied.

Skip Thomas (wall of wine), Norberto Moran (silent auction) and Camile Barnett Cohen and LaRae Hovland (also with wall of wine) made their pleas for their respective areas of the Rotary Gala. There was a surprise appearance by the newest member of the Jon Barnett family (a talking French poodle). St. Paul **Peterson** (he really liked Sir Paul, but that was already taken) mentioned the resemblance between lon and the new poodle was remarkable. Others were less than complimentary.

President Ohe then introduced His Worship, Mayor Jim Hovland, who was program chair for the second time this summer. Jeff said the book on Mayor Hovland's nightstand was Minnesota Vikings, Superbowl Champs. It was a short book with lots of blank pages. Mayor Hovland, not accustomed to public speaking, then introduced Michele Kelm-Helgen. Michele is the appointed chair of the Minnesota Sports Facilities Authority. All members were appointed by Gov. Mark Dayton to oversee the planning and design of the new Vikings stadium. It will be a multipurpose stadium used by the Vikings ten days a year, plus playoff dates (the assumption at this point is just the ten days will be necessary). The other 355 days will be available for public use, including high school and amateur sports, cultural celebrations and entertainment events. The Superbowl is confirmed for 2018 and the Sports Facilities Authority is working on NCAA Final Four, as well as national conventions.

The design of the new stadium will be revolutionary. At its highest point, it will be 25 stories tall. Five, 100-foot-tall doors will pivot open towards the downtown area. The new stadium will be 1.8 million square feet compared to the Metrodome's 975,000 square feet. Capacity will be 65,000 for most events, but could accommodate up 72,000 fans for special events. Construction of the new stadium is currently about 20 percent complete. The stadium will be connected to the city by the skyway system and the exciting city park being built. Wells Fargo has committed to building two 20-story office buildings and there will be a parking ramp with 2,000 parking spaces. A light rail station will be located directly across the street. HCMC has committed to a \$191-million-dollar expansion for their clinic and parking. A total of 7,500 people will have worked on the construction project by the time it is completed. The translucent "ETFE" roof will connect fans to the outdoors. Two HD video boards will be placed at east and west ends of the stadium. Bill McReavy was noted to comment that he hoped they wouldn't block his view of the field from his first-row seats. Tom Bach voiced the same concern for his private suite that will be on the first deck directly on the 50-yard line. Call Tom for details and tickets.

Time was running short as President Ohe nervously checked his watch, and **Norberto** thanked Michele for her presentation.

After the meeting I noticed an encounter between Past President Steve Slyce and ace photographer John Flynn. It seems that Slyce feels there are not enough pictures of him on the Rotary Facebook page and he felt the need to address the situation. John promised to pass the comments along to PR head, Doug Johnson for further review. On hearing this, Doug announced he was leaving on yet another vacation.

As a plug for next weeks meeting, don't miss the distribution of the "Les Rotary Raffle Billets." This is an event not to be missed. Mike Opitz and I have been busy pre-selling these tickets and you will be amazed at the reception they have received already. Bring your check books!

- Doug is seeking more members to work on the committee.
