Prez Ohe had Jean Morrison and Mary Younggren, the cochairs of the 2014 Gala Fundraiser "Rendezvous in Paris," come up to the podium. They announced the financial results of our fundraiser for the Edina Rotary Foundation: \$113,180! Great job! This is a new record, with 317 people attending the event.

Jean Morrison also announced that this year's Edina Rotary Holiday Giving Program will go to: **VEAP**—a non-profit, social service agency that assists low-income families in Bloomington, Edina, Richfield, and south Minneapolis; and Oasis for Youth—a resource center for the homeless that houses youth in Bloomington, Edina, and Richfield. Brad Hepp inducted new member Ron Kallich, sponsored by Ann Platt. Welcome Ron!

Jean Morrison brought the program: Anne Mavity, director of new projects for Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative. This is the youth homeless shelter planned for 66th Street in Edina, known as the 66 West Apartments.

Youth homelessness in the Edina/west metro area is a problem effecting 250 youths. Seventy congregations and counting have come together and are committed to ending homelessness in the Twin Cities. They have come together to build the 66 West Apartments, which will serve about 40 homeless young people pursuing education and career goals. The complex will have 39 studio apartments.

Why are young people homeless? Various reasons exist: conflict in families; parents mental health/chemical/alcohol; poverty; unsafe to stay in home; or transitions from foster care without support.

The housing will provide a haven of support for young people who haven't had the advantages of some of their peers. The location will be ideal near transit and jobs, will serve primarily 18- to 21year-olds, and services onsite will emphasize education and employment, health and healing, and independent living skills. There will be overnight staffing to help at all hours.

Mitch Robinson thanked the speaker. At 1:25 p.m. Prez Ohe made his closing remarks. Prez Jeff looked relieved to have this action-packed meeting completed. (He is now half way through with his presidency.)



Members of the Rotary Club of Edina and Edina Morningside Rotary Club gathered Nov. 26 for the annual Thanksgiving Baskets Assembly. The City of Edina is sponsoring a blood drive with nonprofit partner Memorial Blood Centers. All who live or work in Edina are encouraged to donate blood that day at Edina City Hall, 4801 W. 50th St. Donors must be at least 17 years old or 16 with a signed parental consent form, weigh at least 110 pounds, free of antibiotics for at least 24 hours unless taken daily for a skin condition, and symptom-free for at least three days following a cold or flu.

Step up to donate this month for a chance to win a winter getaway! Present to donate Dec. I-31, 2014 and enter for a chance to win a three-night stay at a Hyatt Place with round-trip airfare for two.
