Dec. 11, 2014

Josh Sprague introduced a student speaker from Edina High School, who gave us an update on what he's doing this year.

Brad Hepp inducted a new member, Amir Gharbi. He was sponsored by **David Clynes**. Amir has an impressive background and we are honored to have him join our club.

Bob Solheim gave a very special presentation to John Flynn in honor of his late father, Robert "Mick" Flynn. John was given the crystal and major donor pin in honor of his parents, and Bob shared thoughts on Mick and Dorothy's dedication to Rotary and financial commitment to The Rotary Foundation.

Past President Steve Slyce came forward and announced the nominations for the Rotary Club of Edina Board of Directors for next Rotary year, 2015-2016. He also congratulated President Jeff on his work so far. Nominations for next year's Board are:

Steve made a motion to approve the five nominees. Motion was seconded and approved by membership.

Kaylin Eidsness then introduced our speaker, Beth Burns from the Minnesota Zoo. Beth is the vice president of external relations. She oversees many aspects of the zoo including marketing, sales, education, programs, government affairs, etc.

Beth thinks she has the coolest job in the world. Out her office windows she gets to see snow monkeys and pumas, and she hoped that her presentation made us all want to go back to the zoo!

The Minnesota Zoo was founded in 1978 and is a state zoo, which is not common. Its current mission is to connect people and animals to the natural world and to save wildlife. The zoo is now organized by eco-systems and it is a very effective way to "see" the zoo. The zoo is one of Minnesota's cultural assets with around 1.2 million visitors each year. There are more than 4,700 animals at the zoo. It has a budget of around \$25 million annually, and has a \$146 million dollar annual impact on the state's economy. The zoo supports 1,738 jobs.

The zoo is a conservation leader in the state and around the world. They spend a lot of time educating the public each year on conservation. Beth told a great story about Skipperling butterflies. There used to be 60 million of these butterflies in the world and now the butterfly is believed to be extinct in the wild. But the zoo is trying to help reintroduce the butterfly into the wild. Beth described the zoo as "smart fun" and "engaging to inspire."

The economics of the zoo are not always fun. They did have layoffs in the fall. Last year the awful cold reduced the number of visitors, and the costs of care for the animals increased because of the cold. But the zoo is working off of a new strategic plan with a sustainable budget model. They will be building new exhibits and adding some additional "normal zoo animals," such as lions and giraffes. Beth's talk was fascinating and definitely enticing. I hope everyone visits the zoo soon.

Will Steinke thanked Beth and let her know that a donation to VEAP will be made in her name. She also donated a pair of passes to the zoo and a stuffed animal to our Holiday Giving Program. Thank you Beth!
