a music business. All five living siblings shared their parents' love for music and followed in their foot steps. Today they are all known both nationally and internationally for their talents.

Patty has received the Minnesota Music award seven times for best vocalist and has performed all of the country. She has received these accolades while also raising four children with her husband.

Patty's talk was on "Live Your Gift." In February 2007 she had a life-threatening cardiac emergency—aortic dissection. She had been living with an irregular heart beat and other heart problems for many years so she knew to call 911 when she felt the problem happening. Patty had to have open-heart surgery to repair her heart. She was lucky to make it through surgery as most aren't so fortunate.

After Patty's near-death experience, she focused on getting better each day to continue living her life to the fullest. She was back singing after only five and half months.

Her message was to take care and be aware of your health concerns. We all have gifts and it's up to us to find them, not squander them. Honor who you are, take care of your health.

Patty ended her inspiring and entertaining talk with a song called "Believe in Yourself." She closed by saying "Live you Gift."
