Tom Bach introduced our speaker, Bill Gray who is president of Uponor Innovations North America in Apple Valley, headquarters in Finland. The Apple Valley division employs approximately 400 people.

Uponor Innovations is a billion-dollar company traded on the Helsinki Exchange and specializes in manufacturing of indoor climate control and plumbing. Uponor has been seeking out innovative ways to ensure our plumbing, radiant heating/cooling (in-floor), hydronic distribution, pre-insulated pipe and fire sprinkler systems offer the most consistent, reliable solutions available to residential and commercial structures around the globe. Their products are made of PEX plastic. PEX is made from high-density polyethylene (HDPE). PEX contains cross-linked bonds in the polymer structure, changing the thermoplastic to a thermoset. Uponor primary focus was originally radiant commercial and residential heating and cooling but found the plumbing market to be the most significant part of their business. In the United States radiant heat has been marketed and priced as a high-end product vs. the European markets.

Uponor has been very successful achieving best practices awards such as 2013 Minnesota Manufacturer of the year, *StarTribune* 100 Best Places to Work, and Excel Energy 2012 Partner of the Year. They have continued to use their engineering expertise to become more sustainable by reducing corrugate in their packaging. Bill gave us the opportunity for a question-and-answer session, where we discovered that folklore says that Uponor has a thing for hiring Swedes and that's how they ended up in Minnesota. Uponor continue to pursue other markets with their PEX plastic engineering and innovations.

Jennifer Bennerote thanked Bill for taking the time to address our club and **President Steve** wrapped up the meeting.
